Main purpose of the role:	

Next Chapte is a domestic abuse charity working across the areas of Tendring, Colchester, Maldon, Chelmsford, Braintree & Uttlesford. We provide free and confidential services to support people who are currently experiencing, or have previously experienced, domestic abuse.

We are passionate about ensuring that every person has the opportunity to live their life free from domestic abuse

As a Family Abuse Support Group Facilitator Volunteer, you will lead group support sessions for individuals who have experienced abuse from a family member — such as a parent, sibling, or adult child. You will create and maintain a safe, supportive, and non-judgmental space where survivors of non-intimate partner abuse can share their experiences, build resilience, and progress in their recovery journey.

Role specific responsibilities:

- To be a positive and reassuring presence
- Plan and facilitate structured group support sessions in line with organisational guidelines
- Create a safe, inclusive, and confidential space that encourages open dialogue and mutual support
- Support group members in sharing experiences, developing coping strategies, and rebuilding confidence
- Manage group dynamics to ensure respectful, balanced participation and emotional safety for all attendees
- Recognise and respond appropriately to distress or disclosures, referring to safeguarding leads as needed
- Keep basic session records, attendance logs, and feedback forms in line with data protection and safeguarding protocols
- Attend supervision, training, and debriefing sessions with relevant staff.
- To be a listening ear from those who have been through a lot of trauma and change.
- To ensure that all safeguarding measures are delivered in respect of the serviceusers
- To adhere strictly to policies and procedures in respect of safeguarding adults and children at risk.
- To always act in a professional manner, communicate effectively and build and sustain appropriate relationships at all times with clients.
- Respect and value the diversity of the client group we work with and recognise the needs and concerns of a diverse range of service users, ensuring the service is accessible to all.

- Ability to work on own initiative
- Friendly, welcoming manner
- Empathy, sensitivity, and a trauma-informed approach to supporting survivors
- Excellent group facilitation skills
- Confidence managing group dynamics and responding calmly to emotional situations
- Good communication skills
- Understanding of issues surrounding confidentiality and safeguarding
- Working in compliance with policies and procedures
- A sincere desire to help people to achieve their goals
- Non- judgmental
- Strong listening skills
- Sensitivity to persons of different educational, economic, cultural or racial backgrounds
- Ability to maintain boundaries
- Willingness to undertaken relevant training
- A good sense of humour
- Flexible approach with basic IT skills
