Instead of providing real solutions, Labor has ignored these concerns, leaving families to bear the burden of poor policy decisions and government inaction.

The WA Liberal Party believes that families deserve better.

We are committed to easing cost-of-living pressures, strengthening community safety, fixing our health system, and ensuring every child has access to a high-quality education.

Unlike the Labor government we will prioritise better healthcare services, introduce stronger crime prevention measures, and provide real relief for households struggling with rising costs.

Under a WA Liberal Government, families will be at the heart of our policies. We will deliver meaningful solutions that improve everyday life — because when families thrive, our entire state prospers.

Only a WA Liberal Government will deliver it.

WHAT WE WILL DO.

The WA Liberals believe Western Australian families deserve a government that understands the challenges they face and takes real action to support them.

The WA Liberal Party is committed to delivering practical solutions that reduce cost-of-living pressures, strengthen healthcare and mental health services, provide better housing opportunities, and ensure safer communities.

Under Labor, families have been burdened by skyrocketing household bills, worsening crime, and a failing healthcare system.

The introduction of Labor's energy tax will only add to the financial strain, making everyday essentials even more expensive.

We will scrap this unnecessary tax and ensure families have access to affordable and reliable energy.

We know that cost-of-living pressures are making it harder for families to keep up.

We will deliver targeted relief to households struggling with rising costs, ensuring families can afford necessities like food, fuel, and housing.

Access to quality healthcare should not depend on where you live.

We will fix the health system by investing in hospitals, reducing wait times, and improving mental health services to support children, parents, and those experiencing crisis.

Family and domestic violence remains a critical issue, and we will increase support for victims, invest in safe housing options, and strengthen laws to better protect families.

Community safety is a top priority.

With crime rising under Labor's watch, we will put more police on the streets and deliver stronger laws to ensure families feel safe in their homes, schools, and neighbourhoods.

Every child deserves the best start in life. We will invest in schools, support teachers, and ensure every student has access to a high-quality education that sets them up for a bright future.

We will also take a responsible and cautious approach to gender-related medical treatments for minors.

A WA Liberal Government will pause the use of puberty blockers for children under 16 until a full, evidence-based review is conducted into their long-term effects which ensures that any medical intervention for children is based on the best available science and prioritises their long-term health and wellbeing.

To better support families balancing work and personal life, we will gradually deregulate retail trading hours, allowing more flexibility for parents to shop at times that suit them.

Modern lifestyles require modern retail policies, and by giving families greater freedom over when they can access essential services, we will make life easier and more convenient.

Western Australians deserve a government that will ensure local businesses can operate efficiently while catering to the needs of working families.

Only the WA Liberal Party will put families first—delivering real solutions that make life easier, safer, and more affordable.



COST-OF-LIVING RELIEF FOR FAMILIES

Western Australian families need a government that understands their struggles and delivers real support to help them thrive.

A Mettam Liberal Government will put families first by providing financial relief, improving access to essential services, and ensuring safer, more supportive communities for parents and children.

Rising costs of living are making it harder for families to afford basic necessities like food, housing, and essential services.

Many parents are under financial stress, with more Western Australians turning to financial counselling services than ever before.

Despite this growing demand, state funding for financial counselling has not increased since 2018, leaving families without the support they need.

A WA Liberal Government will increase funding for financial counselling services by 25 per cent, ensuring more families can access expert advice to manage their finances and avoid crisis.

Grandparents who take on the responsibility of raising their grandchildren often face financial strain, with limited support compared to foster carers.

These Grandcarers provide a stable and loving home, often stepping in unexpectedly to care for children who would otherwise enter the foster system.

The WA Liberal Party recognises their invaluable contribution and will increase the Grandcarers Support Scheme payment from \$1,000 to \$3,000 per grandchild per year, ensuring they have the resources needed to provide for their families.

Supporting children's development is crucial for their future success.

Too many families are being forced to cut back on activities that support childhood learning, social development, and physical well-being due to financial pressures.

We will expand the KidSport program, increasing financial assistance to \$500 per child for one year and restoring eligibility for clubs that promote outdoor and group activities, including Scouts WA and Girl Guides WA.

This will allow more children to participate in sports and recreation that fosters social and physical development.

In addition, many families struggle to afford the educational resources their children need to thrive.

Toy libraries provide an affordable way for parents to access a variety of toys that support childhood development, learning, and play.

A WA Liberal Government will provide \$5,000 grants to toy libraries across the state, ensuring families can access educational and developmental resources at a low cost, helping to reduce financial strain while promoting early childhood learning.

Food insecurity is a growing crisis in Western Australia, with 17 per cent of children struggling to access sufficient nutritious food, placing additional financial strain on families already battling rising living costs.

The Hungry for Change report highlights that without proper nutrition, students face difficulties concentrating, increased absenteeism, and a higher risk of long-term health issues.

Existing food relief programs are often underfunded and inconsistent in meeting the needs of vulnerable children, leaving many without reliable support.

Recognising the urgency of this issue, the WA Liberal Party will invest \$5.2 million in a School Lunch Program to expand food relief initiatives run by Foodbank WA and OzHarvest.

This funding will enable OzHarvest to double the number of schools participating in its Nourishing Our Schools program, particularly in regional areas where food insecurity is more severe, while Foodbank WA will expand its fresh fruit deliveries to an additional 100 metro schools by acquiring a second delivery van.

By ensuring students have access to nutritious meals at school, this initiative not only improves educational and health outcomes but also eases financial pressure on families who are struggling to afford rising grocery bills.

Carers play a vital role in supporting family members with disabilities, chronic illnesses, or frail age.

Around 320,000 Western Australians provide unpaid care to a loved one, often facing financial hardship and personal sacrifice.



ENERGY RELIEF FOR FAMILIES

Rising electricity costs are placing enormous pressure on Western Australian families, forcing many to make difficult choices between paying for essential services like heating and cooling or covering other basic household expenses.

The Cook Labor Government doubled the daily supply in their first budget, from 48.6 cents to 94.9 cents and have since increased it to 113.22 cents per day, adding unnecessary pressure to household budgets.

These cost hikes have hit families hard, making it even more difficult to keep up with already rising living expenses.

A Mettam Liberal Government will reverse Labor's electricity tax by reducing the fixed charge by 46.3 cents per day, delivering much-needed relief to households struggling with high power bills.

A WA Liberal Government will introduce a WA Carer Card, providing concession rates, cost-of-living support, and discounts at participating businesses to help ease financial pressure on carers.

We will also review the WA Carers Strategy to ensure carers receive the recognition and support they deserve.

The WA Liberal Party believes that families are the heart of our communities.

By providing financial relief, expanding support services, and ensuring all children have access to opportunities that help them grow and succeed, we will create a stronger, more supportive Western Australia for families.

This measure will save Western Australian families \$676 over our first term of government, ensuring they can afford to keep their homes comfortable without financial stress.

We are committed to abolishing Labor's electricity tax, putting money back in the pockets of families and easing the burden of the cost-of-living crisis.

This policy is about fairness — ensuring that families are not punished with ever-increasing government-imposed costs but instead have the financial security they need to support their children, pay their bills, and plan for the future.

HEALTHCARE FOR FAMILIES

Western Australian families deserve a healthcare system that is accessible, efficient, and responsive to their needs.

Under the WA Labor families are waiting longer for critical medical care, emergency departments are overwhelmed, and access to essential services has declined.

The WA Liberal Party is committed to fixing these issues by investing in hospital infrastructure, reducing wait times, and expanding community-based healthcare services to support families across the state.

Meningococcal B is a life-threatening disease that disproportionately affects babies, teenagers, and at-risk individuals, yet WA remains one of the few states that does not provide free access to the vaccine.

Every year, families are left making an impossible choice—pay up to \$600 per child for protection or risk their child contracting a disease that can cause death or permanent disability within 24 hours.

A Mettam Liberal Government will remove this financial barrier by committing \$6 million to fully fund a Meningococcal B vaccination program, ensuring babies, teenagers, and high-risk individuals can access this life-saving protection for free.

Other states, including South Australia, Queensland, and the Northern Territory, have already stepped up to protect their communities, yet the Cook Labor Government refuses to act, leaving Western Australian families to bear the financial burden.

With Meningococcal B cases already doubling compared to last year, every delay puts more lives at risk.

By making this vaccine free, we will prevent unnecessary deaths, reduce long-term disability care costs, and ease the strain on WA's healthcare system, saving millions in future health expenses.

Too many parents are struggling to access timely medical treatment for their children, with elective surgery waitlists at crisis levels.

Currently, nearly 30,000 people are waiting for surgery in WA's public hospitals, with thousands waiting longer than medically recommended. This means parents are left watching their children suffer while waiting for necessary procedures.

A WA Liberal Government will introduce an Elective Surgery Guarantee, ensuring that if a patient cannot receive their surgery within the medically recommended timeframe in the public system, they will be treated in the private system at no extra cost.

This commitment will clear the backlog and deliver 15,000 additional surgeries over four years.

Mothers and newborns deserve the highest standard of care, but Labor's decision to move the Women and Babies Hospital to Fiona Stanley Hospital, against the advice of leading doctors, puts vulnerable newborns at risk.

Babies needing urgent care will be forced to travel 20km on the freeway to Perth Children's Hospital, increasing the risk of complications.

A WA Liberal Government will reverse this decision and return the Women and Babies Hospital to its original plan at the Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre, ensuring high-risk newborns, mothers, and families receive world-class care in the safest location.

Access to emergency care is essential, yet families in Perth's northern suburbs are facing long wait times due to a shortage of hospital beds.

Joondalup Health Campus has two fully constructed 30-bed wards sitting empty while the hospital struggles with capacity issues.

A WA Liberal Government will commit \$20 million to fit out these wards and an additional \$30 million per year to make them operational, allowing 4,000 more patients to receive care each year and easing pressure on emergency departments.

A WA Liberal Government is also committed to delivering world-class healthcare infrastructure across Western Australia, ensuring families have access to modern, high-quality medical services no matter where they live.

Royal Perth Hospital (RPH), WA's major trauma hospital, has served the community for nearly two centuries, but its outdated infrastructure is no longer fit for purpose.

With emergency department presentations projected to rise by over a third in the next decade, urgent action is needed to modernise the hospital and expand its capacity.

A WA Liberal Government will commit \$80 million in our first term to begin planning and early site works for a full redevelopment of RPH, with construction to follow in our second term.

This investment will ensure RPH remains a world-class trauma and emergency facility, capable of meeting the needs of a growing population and delivering better health outcomes for all Western Australians.

Emergency departments across Western Australia are in crisis, with families facing unacceptably long wait times and hospitals unable to cope with demand.

Under the Cook Labor Government, ambulance ramping has reached record levels, preventing paramedics from responding to emergencies and leaving patients stuck in ambulances instead of receiving care.

A WA Liberal Government will take immediate action to reduce ambulance ramping by 20 per cent by investing in hospital infrastructure, expanding transitional care beds, and increasing access to urgent care clinics across the state.

To free up hospital beds and improve patient flow, we will deliver 500 additional transitional care beds across WA, ensuring patients who no longer require acute hospital care can transition to appropriate facilities.

This will relieve pressure on emergency departments, reduce wait times, and allow ambulances to offload patients faster.

Additionally, three new St John Urgent Care Clinics will be established, providing families with faster access to non-emergency treatment and diverting lower-priority cases away from hospitals, easing congestion across the health system.

Many families are also struggling to find mental health support for their children. Early intervention is critical in preventing long-term mental health issues, yet prevention funding in WA is being reduced rather than expanded.

A WA Liberal Government will invest \$40 million in mental health prevention programs and an additional \$40 million in targeted suicide prevention initiatives, ensuring children and parents have access to early intervention and crisis support when they need it most.

Eating disorders have become a growing crisis in WA, particularly among young people, yet families have no access to a dedicated residential treatment centre. Many are forced to travel interstate to seek help.

A WA Liberal Government will build WA's first residential eating disorder treatment centre, providing the specialised, long-term care needed for recovery, alongside a new eating disorder hub at Fiona Stanley Hospital.

For families with loved ones battling drug addiction, the lack of rehabilitation options has made recovery nearly impossible.

A WA Liberal Government will introduce compulsory drug rehabilitation programs for repeat offenders struggling with addiction, ensuring they receive professional treatment instead of cycling in and out of the justice system.

This initiative will help rebuild families, reduce crime, and support long-term recovery.

Western Australian families deserve a health system that puts their needs first, ensuring they have access to quality care, timely treatment, and essential mental health and support services.

Only a WA Liberal Government will deliver real healthcare solutions that make life easier for families and provide the care they need, when and where they need it.

HOUSING SECURITY FOR FAMILIES

Western Australian families deserve secure, affordable housing that allows them to build their futures without financial hardship.

Under the Cook Labor Government, the housing crisis has worsened, with supply failing to meet demand, driving up prices and making it harder for families to find suitable homes.

The WA Liberal Party is committed to tackling this crisis head-on by increasing housing supply, reducing financial barriers to home ownership, and ensuring more affordable options are available.

To address the severe housing shortage, we will establish a \$500 million Housing Infrastructure Investment Fund to unlock up to 100,000 new homes, including 90,000 in key growth areas and 10,000 new apartments.

This investment will place downward pressure on housing costs, giving families more choice and reducing competition for available homes.

Many families also struggle with the financial barriers to home ownership, particularly the burden of stamp duty.

To help families enter the housing market, we will raise the stamp duty exemption threshold from \$450,000 to \$550,000 and extend the concession threshold from \$600,000 to \$700,000, saving homebuyers up to \$15,000.

These changes will make it easier for families to purchase their first home and provide long-term financial stability.

For families at risk of homelessness or those struggling to find secure accommodation, we will strengthen the community housing sector by transferring ownership of 1,000 newly built public homes to community housing providers.

This will allow community housing organisations to expand their capacity and provide more affordable homes to vulnerable families.

In addition, we will invest \$6 million in a Community Housing Capacity Building program to ensure these providers have the resources needed to support more Western Australians in need.

Families should not be forced into financial insecurity due to housing shortages and rising costs.

The WA Liberal Party’s plan will not only make home ownership more accessible but will also provide greater security for those struggling to find stable accommodation.

Only a WA Liberal Government is committed to ensuring every Western Australian family has the opportunity to own or rent a home that is safe, affordable, and suitable for their needs.

PROTECTING FAMILIES FROM CRIME

Western Australian families deserve to feel safe in their homes, schools, and communities, yet under the Cook Labor Government, crime has spiralled out of control.

Families are increasingly facing the consequences of rising violence, home invasions, and antisocial behaviour, with police stretched beyond capacity and unable to respond effectively.

The WA Liberal Party is committed to restoring law and order, ensuring that families are protected, and creating safer communities through stronger policing, tougher sentencing, and better support for victims.

Crime rates have surged across the state, with total offenses rising from 230,719 in 2020 to 283,171 in 2024.

Family and domestic violence has reached crisis levels, with incidents increasing by 76% since Labor took office in 2017, making Western Australia the most dangerous state in the country for women.

Many families are living in fear, knowing that perpetrators of domestic violence are too often released back into the community without adequate monitoring or consequences.

A WA Liberal Government will introduce laws to criminalise coercive control, ensuring that emotional and psychological abuse is recognised as a serious offense.

Additionally, we will commit \$20 million to expand refuge capacity, ensuring that women and children fleeing violence have a safe place to go

Our justice system must put the rights of victims above those of offenders.

Under Labor, violent criminals, repeat offenders, and those who pose a clear risk to the public are being granted bail and parole, only to reoffend.

A WA Liberal Government will reform WA's bail and parole system to ensure repeat violent offenders are held accountable and do not pose a continued threat to the community.

This means offenders who commit crimes while out on bail will not be granted bail again, and breaches of bail conditions will result in immediate revocation.

Violent criminals will also be required to serve their full sentences without the possibility of early release.

To further protect families from repeat offenders, we will introduce mandatory GPS tracking for high-risk domestic violence offenders and violent criminals released on bail or parole.

This will ensure that dangerous individuals are closely monitored and that authorities can intervene before they commit further crimes.

For too long, police have been under-resourced, overworked, and left struggling to protect families due to staffing shortages and low morale.

The Cook Labor Government's failure to retain police officers has led to record resignations, with over 1,000 officers leaving the force in just two and a half years.

The WA Liberal Party will recruit an additional 500 police officers over the next four years, ensuring more frontline officers are available to protect communities.

Additionally, we will introduce an overtime initiative for 3,000 officers, immediately adding 300 more frontline officers across WA to increase the police presence and reduce response times.

Our schools must also be safe places where children can learn without fear of violence or disruption.

With youth crime increasing, disengaged students are more likely to fall into criminal behaviour, putting themselves and others at risk.

To address this, a WA Liberal Government will introduce School Engagement Officers, a program that will see retired police officers working with at-risk youth in schools.

This initiative, modelled on the successful Police and Community Youth Centres (PCYC) program, will provide mentorship and intervention to steer young people away from crime and toward positive futures.

Western Australian families deserve a government that takes their safety seriously, prioritising victims over offenders and ensuring that police have the resources they need to protect the community.

The WA Liberal Party is committed to tackling crime, strengthening sentencing laws, and supporting law enforcement to restore safety and security for families across the state.

IMPROVING EARLY CHILDHOOD OUTCOMES FOR FAMILIES

Western Australian families deserve a government that prioritises their children’s development, health, and education, ensuring every child has the best possible start in life.

Under the current system, families are struggling with long wait times for essential child development services, including speech pathology, paediatrics, and allied health, leaving too many children without the support they need during their critical early years.

A Mettam Liberal Government will invest \$110 million in early childhood development, ensuring families can access essential services without unnecessary delays.

Child and Parent Centres play a crucial role in supporting young families by integrating health, education, and social services in one accessible location.

Despite their success, the Cook Labor Government has only added one additional centre in the past eight years, leaving many families without local support.

To address this, a WA Liberal Government will construct 10 new Child and Parent Centres across metropolitan and regional WA, increasing access to maternal and child health services, early learning programs, and parenting support.

These centres will provide families with a seamless pathway to ensure children get the support they need before they enter school.

Many families face significant barriers when trying to access crucial health services for their children.

Thousands of children are waiting for speech pathology assessments, impacting their ability to succeed in school.

To ensure every child receives early intervention, a WA Liberal Government will introduce a school-based speech pathology service, allowing students to receive face-to-face therapy within their school environment.

This program will ensure teachers and parents have direct access to expert advice, helping children overcome speech and language challenges before they become long-term barriers to learning.

Hearing loss is another major factor affecting childhood development, particularly among Aboriginal and disadvantaged children.

Untreated ear infections and hearing issues can lead to speech delays, learning difficulties, and long-term social disadvantages.

To close this gap, the WA Liberal Party will fully fund the Earbus Foundation’s program, expanding mobile ear health clinics across the state.

This investment will bring early diagnosis, treatment, and specialist care directly to schools and communities, ensuring children do not suffer preventable hearing loss.

For families in regional and remote areas, accessing dental care is a growing challenge, with many children missing out on regular check-ups due to distance and cost.

To address this, a WA Liberal Government will fund five mobile dental units, ensuring children in rural communities receive high-quality oral health care within clinically recommended timeframes.

Where public services are unavailable, we will partner with private providers to ensure no family is left without access to essential dental services.

Vision problems are another overlooked barrier to learning, with thousands of children struggling in school due to undiagnosed eyesight issues.

Families often face financial constraints that prevent them from accessing prescription glasses, leaving children at a disadvantage.

A WA Liberal Government will introduce a School Glasses Program, providing vouchers for 20,000 students from Kindergarten to Year 3 to ensure every child has the tools they need to succeed in the classroom.

Mental health remains a growing concern for families, with increasing numbers of children and young people facing anxiety, depression, and other mental health challenges.

Many calls to Kids Helpline from WA children go unanswered due to a lack of resources.

To ensure more young people can access the support they need, a WA Liberal Government will invest \$6.04 million to expand Kids Helpline services, allowing for more counsellors, a Perth-based hub, and stronger links with local mental health providers.

For families raising children with ADHD, accessing diagnosis and support has become increasingly difficult, with median wait times for clinical psychologists and paediatricians stretching to 22 months.

Without timely intervention, children with ADHD face significant challenges in school and beyond.

A WA Liberal Government will invest \$6 million to improve ADHD support, including increased GP training to manage ADHD in collaboration with specialists and expanded professional development programs for teachers, equipping them with the skills to support students with ADHD in the classroom.

By ensuring families have access to essential early childhood development services, a Mettam Liberal Government will improve educational outcomes, reduce long-term health costs, and create stronger, more resilient communities.

Only a WA Liberal Government is committed to delivering these essential reforms, ensuring Western Australian families receive the support they deserve.



IMPROVING EDUCATION OUTCOMES FOR FAMILIES

Western Australian families deserve a strong education system that ensures every child, regardless of their background or location, has the opportunity to succeed.

Under the Cook Labor Government, schools have been left struggling with overcrowded classrooms, under-resourced teachers, and a lack of vital student support services.

A Mettam Liberal Government will invest \$210 million in education, ensuring students receive the resources, infrastructure, and support they need to thrive in school and beyond.

Families in regional and remote WA face additional barriers to accessing quality education, often needing to send their children away from home to attend school.

The Boarding Away from Home Allowance (BAHA) has steadily declined under Labor, failing to keep up with rising costs.

A WA Liberal Government will increase BAHA to \$3,000, providing critical financial relief to regional families and ensuring children from remote areas have the same opportunities as their metropolitan counterparts.

Extracurricular activities play an important role in a child's development, building confidence, teamwork, and resilience.

Country Week is a long-standing tradition that allows regional students to participate in sporting and cultural competitions yet rising travel and accommodation costs have made it unaffordable for many families.

To ensure more students can take part, a WA Liberal Government will introduce an \$8 million Country Week Assistance Program, reducing the financial burden on parents and ensuring no child misses out due to cost.

Early childhood education is the foundation for lifelong learning, yet too many families are struggling to access play-based and culturally inclusive early learning programs.

A WA Liberal Government will expand the Kindilink program, which provides play-and-learn activities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and their families, ensuring more children are prepared for school.

Additionally, we will expand the CaLDEYLink program, supporting culturally and linguistically diverse families with early learning opportunities that foster school readiness.

Many children face speech and language difficulties that impact their learning and social development yet wait times for speech pathology services remain unacceptably long.

A WA Liberal Government will introduce a school-based speech pathology program, delivering face-to-face support in 100 primary schools across the state.

This initiative will provide early intervention, targeted therapy, and professional development for teachers, ensuring children receive the support they need before these challenges become long-term barriers.

Families are also increasingly concerned about school safety, with violence and behavioural issues on the rise.

Despite multiple action plans, Labor has failed to address these concerns, leaving teachers feeling unsafe and suspension rates at record highs.

A WA Liberal Government will invest in two new Behavioural Management Centres, providing specialised support for students with complex behavioural needs while ensuring all children can learn in a safe and structured environment.

For families raising children with ADHD, accessing diagnosis and support has become increasingly difficult, with wait times for clinical psychologists and paediatricians stretching to 22 months.

A WA Liberal Government will invest \$6 million to improve ADHD support, expanding professional development for teachers and increasing GP training to ensure families receive timely diagnosis and ongoing care.

School infrastructure is another critical issue for families, with many schools struggling with overcrowded classrooms and outdated facilities.

A WA Liberal Government will invest \$127 million in school infrastructure, upgrading classrooms, outdoor spaces, and essential amenities to ensure all students learn in a modern, well-equipped environment.

Western Australian families deserve an education system that gives every child the opportunity to reach their full potential.

By investing in school infrastructure, student support services, and critical early learning initiatives, a WA Liberal Government will ensure all children — no matter where they live — have the resources they need to succeed.
