Project cargo involves complex, high-value movements where standard cargo insurance approaches may be inadequate. This course provides a focused introduction to project cargo insurance, helping participants understand how risks arise, how cover is structured, and how claims typically develop. Emphasis is placed on practical considerations relevant to underwriting, broking, and claims handling.
