The judges may, at their discretion, award Medal Cards of the same value to different exhibits in the same class, judged as being of equal merit. The decision of the judges is final.

Class1 Island Displays. Free standing displays, to be viewed from all sides.
Minimum circumference of 25m.

Class 7 Non Plant but Garden Related stands 6m x 2m ground space (**No prize money**)

Security

Exhibitors are reminded that responsibility for the security of their displays / stock etc. rests with them although night staff will be on duty from Wednesday 3rd June 2026. The RCAA accepts no responsibility for any damage or loss and it is essential that exhibitors ensure that they have adequate insurance cover in place.

REGULATIONS

1. Exhibits may be staged from noon on Sunday 1st June up to 6.30pm on Wednesday 3rd June.
2. **Please note that judging of Classes 1 - 5 is at 6.30pm on Wednesday 3rd**
3. For **Classes 1 to 5** there is an entry fee of £150 plus VAT and if this will include staging if wanted (see page 5 for the various options available) plus 2 x 6ft selling tables (if required), and a Wi-fi connection. An extra table can be requested for exhibitors in Class 1 for an additional £70 plus VAT.

The following rules also apply to classes 1 – 5

5a During show days trade exhibitors are permitted to sell plants from their displays but they must be replaced by another of similar quality to maintain the standard of the display.

5b Dutch trollies and excess plant materials are to be stored out of view.

5c No plants are to be on the ground in front of the sales tables. For island stands, an outdoor storage facility will be provided immediately outside the marquee.

5d Sales tables, which should be properly draped, will be considered as part of the exhibit by the judges.

4. **Class 6** is for nurseries who wish to sell plants but not build a display and there is an entry fee of £180 plus VAT for a 5m x 3m indoor ground space. Please note that these stands can, on request, be judged but there is **no prize money**.
5. **Classes 1 – 6** should be of predominantly plant materials although garden related accessories may be included in the display.
6. **Class 7** is for Non-plant but garden related materials and these are permissible for a fee of £425 plus VAT for a 6m x 2m stand. **These stands do not qualify for any prize monies.**
7. Payments must be made by BACS at the same time as the application and where applications are not accepted by the committee, the payment will be returned. Any exhibitor who cancels their display after May 1st will forfeit their payment. No alteration to the size, shape or position is permitted without the consent of the Flower Show Director. A VAT invoice will be raised on receipt of payment.
8. Judges will include points for artistic merit and originality in displays.
9. Trade badges are to be worn at all times by exhibitors. Two badges per stand will be issued and a total of six one day passes, any tickets over and above this amount will be considered on merit.

10. Any disturbance of the turf or soil must be properly reinstated. All materials, plants etc and all debris must be removed from the Showground by the exhibitors/competitors or a charge will be made. Nothing must be left/disposed of on the Showground.
11. The judges are at liberty to withhold awards where the exhibits are deficient in merit. The decision of the Judges shall be final.
12. Trophies should be returned to the Flower marquee office at the end of the Show unless agreed otherwise. Any trophy retained by the exhibitor must be returned to the RCAA office in clean condition prior to the next Show. Trophies will be presented at 9am (approx.) on the first day of the Show.
13. The Committee reserves the right to disqualify or to remove any exhibit.
14. For security reasons payment of awards will be made by BACS by the main Show Office after the Show, and the exhibitor's bank account details must be included on the application form.
15. The Flower Pavilion is a non-smoking area.
16. Any live exhibits used in displays (birds, livestock etc) please check before with Main Office for any Defra etc regulations.
17. No dogs allowed in Flower Pavilion during staging except for assistance dogs.
18. When manning stands, smart dress is required as standards of dress should reflect the standard of your exhibit and the Show as a whole. Exhibitors are advised to keep money on their person either in pockets or waist bags. In particular this applies to island displays where theft could easily occur.

All exhibitors who apply for space in the Flower Pavilion are deemed to have read and to abide by these regulations. Any infringement of these regulations may affect space allocation by the Committee for future Shows.
