1. Exhibits may be staged from 9.00am on the Wednesday prior to the Show. **STAGING IN JUNIOR SECTION NOT ALLOWED AFTER 6.00PM UNLESS BY PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH Miss J Deacon. No dogs allowed in Flower Tent during staging (other than assistance dogs).**
2. The Show will be held as a section of the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Exhibition at Wadebridge on 4th 5th & 6th June 2026.
3. The Flower Tent will be open from 9.00am to 6.30pm on Thursday, 8.30am to 6.30pm on Friday and 8.30am to 4.45pm on Saturday. The last admittance on each day will be 30 minutes before closure. **Competitive exhibits may not be removed before 5.00pm on Saturday 6th June. Exhibitors ignoring this regulation may not be able to exhibit in future shows.**
4. Exhibitors must make their entries on the Entry Forms provided with this schedule to arrive not later than 1st May 2026. Cancellations must be notified by 19th May. **Entries will only be accepted if entry forms are received by Miss J Deacon.**
5. Exhibitors are not entitled to free entry to the Showground.
6. Any naming of flowers and plants must be done on plain labels.
7. The Committee will not be liable for loss or damage to exhibits or personal property.
8. The judges will be at liberty to withhold awards where the exhibits are deficient in number or merit. **The decision of the Judges shall be final.**
9. **The Committee reserves the right to disqualify or remove any exhibit.**

10. **The trophies are held for one year, and are to be returned to the Section Secretary in clean condition by 1st May.** For alternative arrangements please telephone 01841540147.
11. **All exhibits, if required by the exhibitor, must be claimed by 6.00pm on the third day of the show, unless prior arrangements are made with Miss Deacon.**
12. Winners may collect their trophies between 1.30pm and 5.00pm on Saturday from the Flower Pavilion Office.
13. **All materials, plants etc and all debris must be removed from the Showground by the exhibitors/competitors or a charge will be made. Nothing must be left/disposed of on the Showground.**

JUNIOR CLASSES

Theme: “Looking after our Environment”

Entries are welcomed from individual children and students up to and including age 18 as well as from schools, colleges and other organisations.

Classes are split into Key Stages, “a” Preschool & KS1, “b” KS2 and “c” KS3 & above

Individual exhibitors are limited to one entry per class. The maximum number of entries from schools and colleges are detailed below each class.

All materials to be provided by the exhibitor.

To avoid disqualification, all entries must be the UNAIDED work of the exhibitors and be undertaken without any form of assistance from any adults.

ROYAL CORNWALL CERTIFICATES and ROSETTES will be given for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prizes in each class except in the case of low entry when the judges will give special consideration.

CLASSES 1 – 4: GARDENS / FLOWERS

Class 1 – The Rainforest

A design created with the aid of plants which need not be rooted. The arrangement to be exhibited in a standard seed tray.

Up to 10 exhibits per school.

1a – Pre School & KS1, 1b – KS2, 1c – KS3 & above.

Class 2 – A Moment in Nature

An exhibit of flowers and foliage arranged in own container.

Space allowed 40cm x 40cm.

2a – Pre School & KS1, 2b – KS2, 2c – KS3 & above.

Arrangements in Classes 2a, 2b and 2c must be the unaided exhibitor's work and created on site, in the tent on Wednesday 3rd June 2026.

Class 3 – A Pollinator Friendly Posy in a Recycled Container

To be displayed in container similar size of a jam jar or can.

Up to 10 exhibits per school. 3a – Pre School & KS1, 3b – KS2, 3c – KS3 & above.

Class 4 – Any one specimen flower/bloom

This exhibit must have been grown at home or in school or been in possession of the exhibitor for at least 6 weeks before the show (no artificial materials). A vase will be provided for staging.

Up to 10 exhibits per school

4a – Pre School & KS1, 4b – KS2, 4c – KS3 & above.

CLASSES 5 – 9: CRAFT

Class 5 – A Bug Hotel with Guests

Space allowed 30cm x 30cm. **Up to 30 exhibits per school. 5a – Pre School & KS1, 5b – KS2, 5c – KS3 & above.**

Class 6 – A Tile with Imprints from Nature

Made from clay or similar material. To be displayed in an area no larger than 15cm x 15cm.

Maximum of 30 exhibits per school. 6a – Pre School & KS1, 6b – KS2, 6c – KS3 & above.

CLASS 7- COLLAGE COMPETITION

Themes : “An Endangered Animal”

“A Coral Reef”

“An Ancient Woodland”

Each collage should be based on one subject and this should be indicated on each exhibit. **Size 60cm x 60cm** Mounted on rigid paper/card. Please **DO NOT** use hardboard. **Mainly natural materials should be used.**

It is intended that these collages should form a backdrop for the other Junior Classes.

7a – Pre School & KS1, 7b – KS2, 7c – KS3 & above.

Class 8 – A Colourful Bird

Must be capable of being hung for display purposes. Maximum size 40cm (Diameter) x 80cm (Overall Length).

Maximum of 15 exhibits per school. 8a – Pre School & KS1, 8b – KS2, 8c – KS3 & above.

Class 9 – A free standing display - “An Explorer”

Exhibitors to create a free standing display on a firm base. Floor space allowed 60cm x 60cm. Maximum height 170cm. To be made from recycled materials.

Only 3 entries per school. 9a – Pre School & KS1, 9b – KS2, 9c – KS3 & above.

CLASSES 10 – 13: LIVE PLANT

These exhibits must have been grown at home or school or been in possession of the exhibitor for at least 6 weeks before the show (no artificial plant material). This enables children to learn about and care for growing plants.

Class 10 – Bee Friendly Window Box. Window box not to exceed 80cm x 25cm. It must not contain any artificial plant material. Suitable staging will be provided.

Up to 5 exhibits per school. 10a – Pre School & KS1, 10b – KS2, 10c – KS3 & above.

Class 11 - An Arrangement of Plants Growing in Shoes or Boots to Reuse Old Footwear. This should contain a minimum of two different plants. It must not contain any artificial plant material. Space allowed 30cm x 30cm.

11a – Pre School & KS1, 11b – KS2, 11c – KS3 & above.

Class 12 - A Collection of Plants Growing in Pot made from Recycled Material

Plants, cultivated from seed, growing in a recycled material plant pot. Space allowed 30cm x 30cm.

Up to 5 exhibits per school. 12a – Pre School & KS1, 12b – KS2, 12c – KS3 & above.

Class 13 - A Selection of Edible Plants growing in a Cooking Pot.

Space allowed 50cm x 50cm.

13a – Pre School & KS1, 13b – KS2, 13c – KS3 & above.

Notes from the Judges and Committee.

Please could all exhibitors be very mindful about the size of their exhibit and keep within the stated space restrictions.

Please be aware that no exhibitor name should be showing but we do request that all exhibits are labelled out of sight (on the back or bottom) with school/ exhibitor name.

Please note that the Committee cannot be responsible for exhibits which are not collected after the show. The showground is accessible on the Sunday morning for collection but please confirm this with Miss Deacon prior to the show.

The TRELAWNEY GARDEN CENTRE CHALLENGE CUP will be awarded to the best overall exhibit across Classes 2a, 2b and 2c Flower Arrangements.

The IAN BURNETT CUP will be awarded to the school that achieves the highest total number of points in the Junior Section.

The TREVE HOLMAN CHALLENGE CUP will be awarded to the most successful exhibitor in the whole Junior Section.

Trophy winners may collect their trophies between 1.30pm and 5.00pm on Saturday from the Flower Show Office.
