

2026 Equine Exhibitor Important Notices

Please read the following 2026 Royal Cornwall Show amendments that are applicable to the Horse Section.

Timetable Changes:

- Irish Draught in-hand classes will now be held on the Thursday.
- Skewbald & Piebald in-hand & ridden classes will run on the Friday.
- All Driving classes will now take place on the Friday.
- The Riding Horse Breeding & Hack Breeding classes have been amalgamated to run on the Friday morning as the Light Horse Breeding classes.
- Saturday's Open Intermediate Show Riding class will now be for Show Riding Horse and Hacks.

Hats:

Hats to the following standard must be worn at all times whilst on the showground, this includes when in the ring, lorry park, practice or collecting areas. Current standards as listed: PAS 015 2011; VG1 2014-12; (BS) EN1384 2023; ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap securely and correctly fastened at all times. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. Exhibitors showing within the Morgan, Iberian and Side Saddle/Astride costume classes are exempt from this rule at their own risk but are strongly advised that they should wear a hat as outlined above, any variation to this ruling for these mentioned classes is solely at the exhibitors' risk. Morgan exhibitors are advised by their society to wear approved hats (PAS 015 2011 at least) but if they wish to wear straw hats during the judging of their classes it is at their own risk. Horse displays/demonstrations within the Main Ring and Countryside Ring are exempt from this rule but participants do so at their own risk, this exemption does not include the Inter-Hunt Relay and Showjumping classes.

Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap securely and correctly fastened at all times. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. Exhibitors showing within the Morgan, Iberian and Side Saddle/Astride costume classes are exempt from this rule at their own risk but are strongly advised that they should wear a hat as outlined above, any variation to this ruling for these mentioned classes is solely at the exhibitors' risk. Morgan exhibitors are advised by their society to wear approved hats (PAS 015 2011 at least) but if they wish to wear straw hats during the judging of their classes it is at their own risk. Horse displays/demonstrations within the Main Ring and Countryside Ring are exempt from this rule but participants do so at their own risk, this exemption does not include the Inter-Hunt Relay and Showjumping classes.
