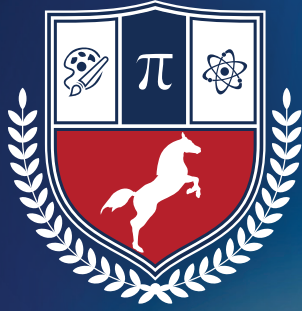
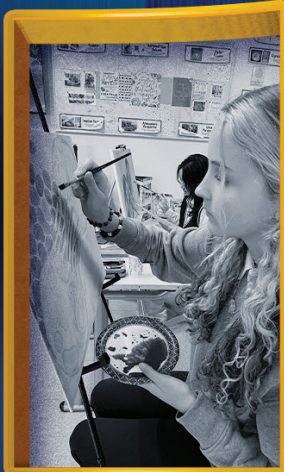

Brief Story

Fulton Science Academy Private School was founded in 2012 as a K through 6 nonprofit. Our school started with 100 students in 2012 and recently reached close to 1000 students. The FSA High School was officially formed in 2016. The first senior class, consisting of 8 students, graduated in May 2019. Currently, our senior **Class of 2026** has **68** seniors.

Mustang Time

High school students have a period of 25 minutes of academic support and social development daily called Mustang Time. During this time, students participate in the following: house meetings, college and career readiness, social emotional learning, visits with professional speakers, leadership development using FSA's Thrive Leadership Curriculum, and visits with college representatives.

FSA House System

FSA's House System, launched in 25-26, divides all 9-12 students equally into Nova, Beacon, Valor, and Haven. This random grouping promotes cross-grade mentorship, leadership, and community spirit through year-round competition and service.

AP Course Placements

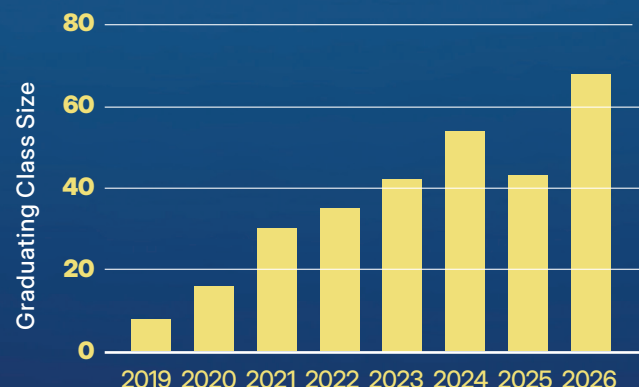
AP course placements are based on several qualifying criteria: nationally normed test scores (MAP English and Math), PSAT/SAT scores, teacher recommendations, and performance in current classes. To be approved for an AP course, a student must receive approval from a core subject teacher and the assigned counselor who will deem the appropriateness of the schedule. The rigor of FSA courses is geared towards promoting AP exam success. If students are unable to take a preferred course, it is usually due to schedule constraints and the school size.

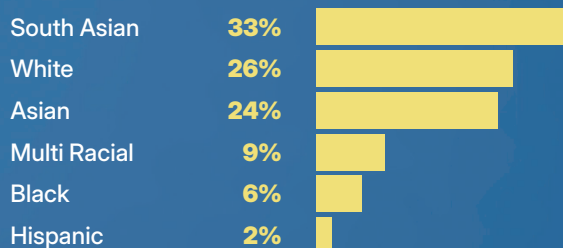

Our school works using a semester system and includes two semesters of 18 weeks for a total of 180 instructional days. High school students attend 7 periods daily beginning at 7:55 AM for 51 minutes each. School ends at 2:55 PM. Additionally, the school offers a variety of after school enrichment opportunities (clubs, academic teams, and honor societies).

AP Cap Policy

Most of the top performing FSA students would graduate with an maximum of 10 AP courses as some of the courses requested might conflict with their schedule or might not be offered for that year. If a student truly desires to challenge themselves they can take up to 14 AP courses.

Dual Enrollment Opportunities

Our students have the opportunity to dual enroll at many universities in Georgia. The majority of our dual enrolled students attend Georgia Institute of Technology, Georgia State University, Kennesaw State University, and Gwinnett Technical College. FSA recommends dual enrollment during junior and senior years in addition to their AP courses.

We transitioned our grading system from a 100-point scale to a 4.00 scale during the summer of 2025. During this transition, for historical data (which differs from the chart above only for the following grades), an A was assigned for scores between 90 and 96, a B for scores between 80 and 86, and a C for scores between 70 and 76. In this process, the designations of A-, B-, and C- were not applied. Moving forward, we will utilize the chart presented above.
