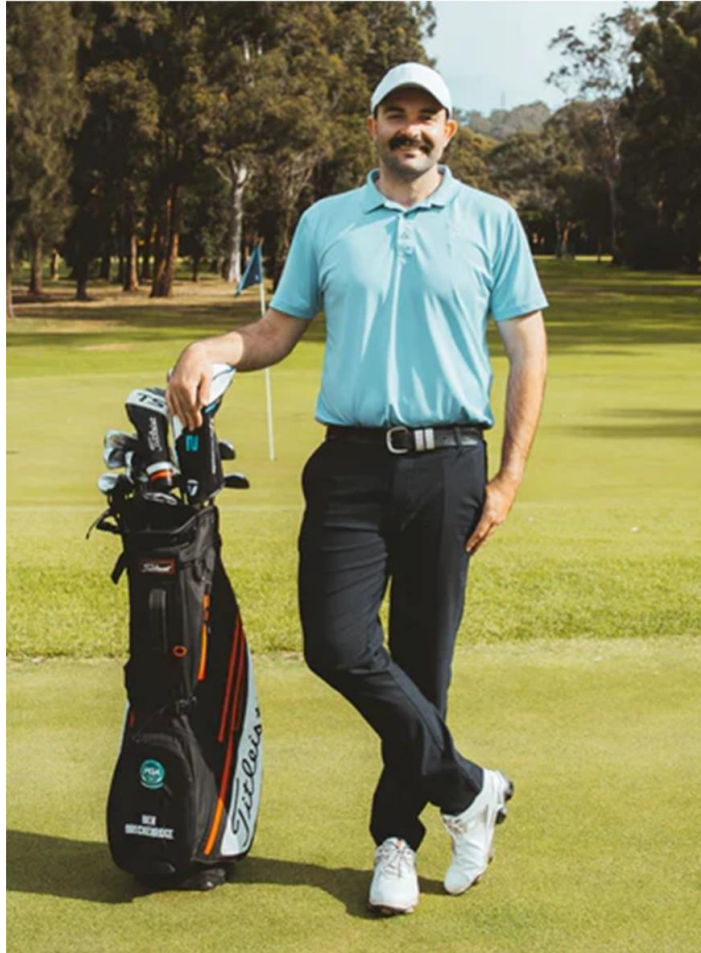

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GOLFING ETIQUETTE

THE GAME OF GOLF

In the interest of all, know the rules and observe the etiquette of the game of Golf, it's not only a tribute to you but also to the club.

Players should play without delay, ensuring that you keep up with the group in front at a reasonable pace. It's the responsibility of the lowest marker to monitor the speed of play. If a group fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match following to pass.

Mark your scorecard on the next tee. Remember, players behind you also wish to fulfil their round. Slow play is selfish and affects all players.

No player shall move, talk, or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.

A player who has incurred a penalty should notify their opponent or marker as soon as possible.

In the absence of Special Rules, two-ball matches should have precedence over and be entitled to pass any three or four-ball match.

BEFORE YOUR GAME

Tee Times: Members should be available to collect their cards 15 minutes before the booked tee time.

Booking Sheet: Members wishing to cancel a booked time must notify the Golf Shop staff at least 24 hours prior to the booking.

Before Play: Members should read any notices regarding local rules or notices relating to the play of competition. Members should check their scorecards to check for any temporary local rules.

DURING YOUR GAME

Mobile Phones: Mobile phones are allowable with discretion, however constant use is frowned upon.

Lost Golf Ball: The Rules of Golf (18.2a (1)) stipulate that you are only allowed 3 minutes (180 seconds) to search for a lost golf ball.

Players searching for a ball should signal the player/s behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent the ball will not easily be found. They should not continue to play until the players following them have passed and are out of range.

ADOPT A “READY-GOLF” ATTITUDE

Below are some ready-golf recommendations for all players to consider while playing a round at Leonay Golf Course.

On Par 4 or Par 5 Holes

- If the group in front are in range of longer hitters, allow shorter hitters to play first from the tee or fairway if longer hitters are waiting to hit first regardless of who has the honour (let them know you are going to!). No player should play until the group in front is out of range.

NOTE: Teeing off out of turn is not applicable when playing Match Play format.

- When chipping or putting, play your shot if the player furthest away is not ready.
- Putt out if you do not interfere with another player's line.
- Hit your shot before helping to look for a lost ball.
- Move buggies and carts away from the front of the green before putting out.
- Leave the putting green immediately after all the players have putted out.

On Par 3's

- **Calling-up on a par 3 hole is not encouraged.** Any player calling-up a following group does so at the players own risk.
- Playing golf involves inherent risks, including risk of being struck by a golf ball. The risk of being struck significantly increases when players “call-up” the following group on a par 3 hole.

AFTER YOUR GAME

Score Cards:

- The rules of golf place the onus on the competitor to see that their correct score is recorded by their marker for each hole.
- The score must be recorded by their marker at the completion of each hole.
- Scorecards **MUST** be returned promptly after the completion of the round.
- The practice of writing up cards in the clubhouse is not permitted.
- The competitor must;
 1. ensure that the marker has signed the card,
 2. ensure that the player has signed the card,
 3. ensure their card is correctly scanned, saved and recorded at the scanning terminal in the Pro Shop (or upstairs in the Clubhouse if available),
 4. ensure their card is placed in the competition box in the Pro Shop,
 5. any alteration on the card must be initialled by the marker.

NOTE: The Rules of Golf state that a players scratch score which is signed for and recorded LOWER than what was actually scored is subject to disqualification. A players scratch score that is signed for and recorded HIGHER than what was actually scored will stand.

COURSE CARE

COURSE RULES: THE COURSE STAFF HAVE RIGHT OF WAY AT ALL TIMES

Members and visitors are requested to assist the course staff in the proper maintenance of the course by:

- Carrying and using the sand buckets provided
- Using bins provided for disposal of rubbish.
- Keep Golf Carts at least 15 metres away from the greens.
- After having played out of a bunker, a player should carefully repair all marks made therein. Rake Bunker inward and place rake in the centre of the bunker.

REPAIRING BALL MARKS



- Always start at the back of the mark and push forward with the repairer.
- Use repairer around all sides and slowly ease turf toward the centre of the mark. Do not lift the soil upwards.
- Lightly tap down with your putter.
- Your completed repairs should look like the images above.

REPAIRING DIVOTS



- A player should ensure all divots are replaced or filled with sand and any damage on the putting surface is repaired.

HOUSE RULES

CODE OF CONDUCT

Members are expected to take pride in their Club regarding dress and conduct generally and to assist in the observance of the by-laws of the Leonay Golf Club.

HANDICAPS

All Members and Visitors male handicaps are to be 36 maximum.

DRESS CODE ON THE COURSE

- Satisfactory footwear must be worn. Ripple sole shoes, thongs, sandals, and high heels shoes are not permitted under any circumstances.
- Shorts with short sports socks are permitted.

COMPLAINTS / PROTESTS

All complaints must be made in writing to the Secretary of the Men's Golf Committee who will submit them to the next meeting of the Men's Golf Committee.

All protests or disputes in connection with a competition or match shall be submitted in writing within 15 minutes of the completion of the round to the Captain, Secretary, or other member of the Men's Golf Committee.

SCANNING & CHECKING YOUR SCORE CARD

It is the responsibility of EACH INDIVIDUAL PLAYER regardless if they are the one scanning and saving their score card using the scoring machine or not, to ensure their score physically written on the score card matches with that on the scanning machine.

A small unintended pencil mark on the score card can be accidentally picked up by the scanner as an incorrect score which can result in an incorrect score being recorded and as a consequence, incorrect prizes awarded. You MUST CHECK that the score card/s match the score/s on the scanner. If there is a need to edit a score and you're not sure how to do so, have the Pro Shop staff assist you before the scores are saved.

RIGHT OF THE COURSE

The President and Captain shall have the right of the course at any time should they desire to exercise that right.

MATCH COMMITTEE

The Match Committee reserves the right to alter the programme, Grades and other conditions of play or competition rules at any time prior to, or during competition if those alterations do not interfere or conflict with the Rules of Golf.

STARTING TIMES

Members are requested to report to the starter 15 minutes before their hit-off time; otherwise, they may lose their place and may be sent to the end of the field or may incur a penalty (suspension or disqualification) as the Match Committee may decide. Saturday starting times are as programmed on the Starting Sheet. Members are responsible for their own tee-times on the Starting Sheet – no exceptions given. The times selected on the Starters Sheet by members will be accepted and adopted by the Match Committee as the official starting times i.e., THE TIME LAID DOWN BY THE MATCH COMMITTEE. **NOTE:** Any member who fails to attend in accordance with their starting time may be DISQUALIFIED in accordance with RULE 6 -3 of the Rules of Golf.

HANDICAPS FOR DIFFERENT TYPES OF COMPETITIONS

ALL OPEN COMPETITIONS

- Stroke - Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicap.
- Stableford - Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicap.
- Par - Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicap.
- Foursomes - see Table Below.
- Ambrose - see Table Below.

FOURSOMES

A Fraction of Combined Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicaps (see below)

- Standard or Mixed Foursomes $\frac{1}{2}$ x Combined
- Canadian or American Foursomes $\frac{3}{8}$ x Combined

AMBROSE

A Fraction of Combined Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicaps (see below)

- 2 players $\frac{1}{4}$ x Combined
- 3 players $\frac{1}{6}$ x Combined
- 4 players $\frac{1}{8}$ x Combined

**Minimum 3 drives
each player.**

NOTE: When playing Ambrose events, each player MUST have a minimum number of their tee-shots used and recorded on the score card, failure to do so will result in disqualification.

MATCH PLAY

Handicapped Event: Highest handicapped player plays off the full difference in G.A. Daily Handicaps and receives shots in accordance with Match Play Index on the back of the scorecard, obtained from the Pro Shop.

Scratch Event: No handicap is applicable.

HOW TO PLAY THE FOLLOWING SINGLES BASED FORMATS

STROKE EVENTS INCLUDING MEDAL ROUNDS

The score of each hole is recorded on the Scorecard provided. At the end of play this is calculated with the player's handicap deducted. Almost all Members' competitions are open events. **However**, visitors including honorary members from reciprocal clubs cannot win a Championship or a Medal. If a visitor wins a Medal Round they will be awarded with the appropriate prize, but the medal itself will be awarded to the most successful member according to the rules for this competition.

STABLEFORD

The method of playing Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as indicated on the Scorecard and to score points on the nett results at each hole. At the end of the round all points are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner in their respective Grades.

ALTERNATIVE STABLEFORD FORMATS

American Single Stableford: Played like a normal Stableford game but with no handicap. The player's handicap is added at the end of their round with the points accumulated during the round. Once a player has reached a stroke score worse than a double bogey (2 over par) and has not holed out, the player is to pick up and proceed to the next hole without delay.

Irish Single Stableford: Played like a normal Stableford game, points are multiplied and added to the Scorecard as follows.

- Holes 1-6 1 x Stableford score
- Holes 7-12 2 x Stableford score
- Holes 13-18 3 x Stableford score

NOTE: If a player is unsure how to score the alternative stableford formats above, a player is to record their stroke score without holding up play. The scores will be processed by the computer in the Pro Shop.

HOW TO PLAY THE FOLLOWING TEAM BASED FORMATS

STANDARD FOURSOMES

One player tees off from odd numbered tees, the other player tees off from even numbered tees. Alternate shots are then taken until the ball is holed.

CANADIAN FOURSOMES

Both players play tee shots at every hole and afterwards continue with whichever ball they nominate with the partner playing the second stroke.

AMERICAN FOURSOMES

Both players play tee shots at each hole and then play a second stroke with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as in regular Foursomes with the OWNER of the ball selected playing the third shot.

NOTE: In any Foursomes event, if one player incurs a penalty stroke, this does not alter the order of play. In Foursome stroke competitions held over several rounds, the order of teeing-off may be changed by a team between rounds unless the Match Committee has laid down a condition of play that the original order of play must be preserved or changed through the competition. Foursomes can be played under either Stroke Play rules or Match Play conditions and Rule 22 is relevant to Foursomes.

MIXED FOURSOMES

Played as Standard Foursomes however teams must comprise of one male player and one female player. The gendered order of teeing-off is as follows: Week 1, Men – odds & Ladies – evens. In the following week, the gendered order of teeing-off will be swapped. **Out of Bounds or Lost Tee Shot for Mixed Foursomes:** Regardless of gender, if a ball is deemed to be lost or hit out of bounds from the tee box, the ball must be re-hit from the original tee box markers, taking a penalty with the playing partner playing the next shot. The ball is allowed to be teed-up.

IRISH 4-BALL STABLEFORD

Playing as a team of four, all players play out each hole as they would in individual stableford. On the first six holes, only the best stableford score of the four players is recorded. On the next six holes (holes 7-12 inclusive) only the best two stableford scores are recorded. On the next six holes (holes 13-18 inclusive), only the best three stableford scores are recorded.

AMBROSE

A Stroke event played by teams of 4, 3 or 2 players, each player tees off, then a preferred ball is selected for each player to hit from again.

NOTE: Each player MUST have a **minimum number of their tee-shots used** and recorded on the card, failure to do so will result in disqualification.

The dropping and/or placing distance once a preferred ball is chosen is as follows:-

- **Through the Green without preferred lies:** dropped within 1 club-length of the chosen ball, no nearer the hole.
- **Through the Green with preferred lies (where applicable):** placed within 1 club-length of the chosen ball, no nearer the hole.
- **On the Green:** placed within 1 putter-head-length of the chosen ball, no nearer the hole.

As in Stroke play, this is continued until the ball is holed.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entrants must be a financial member of Leonay Golf Club in one of the following categories for at least 3 months prior to the start of the Championships:

- Full Male, Senior Male, Intermediate Male (I or II) or Junior Male Membership.
- 7-Day Female members are permitted to play in each of the corresponding Daily Competitions and are eligible to win Daily Competition prizes, but are not eligible to have their scores considered for the Men's Club Championships.

Other Conditions of Entry:

- Entry Fees must be paid in full prior to the commencement of the first round of the Championship event.
- A member must hold a valid Golf Australia handicap.
- Have at least 10 individual cards submitted in the 12 months prior to the 1st round.
- Members are only eligible to play in one grade of Championships in a calendar year.
- Members must remain financial over the duration of the competition. This includes any Match Play event that may be qualified for as a result of competing.

NOTE: Application can be made to the Match Committee prior to the Championship if extraordinary circumstances prevent a member complying with these conditions.

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The top eight (8) qualifiers in A, B, C Grades (and Juniors if applicable) will play in a seeded draw in the final round of the Club Championships, at a time specified by the Match Committee. Failure to adhere to this condition will result in the member being ineligible to win a championship and will be excluded from the Match Play Championship, with only extraordinary exceptions considered.

Championships include both Scratch and Nett Results:

- Men's Club Championship (Open to Leonay 7-day Male Members Only)
- Men's Foursomes Championship (Open to Leonay 7-day Male Members Only)

MATCH PLAY

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible, Players/Teams must complete all rounds set down by the Match Committee.

PLAYING CONDITIONS

- Players/Teams that have qualified to participate in any Match Play Final Series including all preliminary knock-out rounds, must report to the Pro Shop prior to commencement of their Match.
- Players/Teams ARE NOT PERMITTED to "have an arrangement" whereby they tee-off from incorrect plates for a given Match Play competition.
- In the event both parties cannot agree to a Match Play date and time:
 - i. If Players/Teams cannot agree on a suitable Match Play date and time for preliminary/final rounds (unless in events where the Match Committee specifies Preliminary/Finals dates and times), the higher ranked Player/Team will progress through to the next round.
 - ii. Players/Teams that cannot agree on a suitable date and time may apply to the Match Committee in writing for consideration for extenuating circumstances.
 - iii. Where the Match Committee decides to accept those extenuating circumstances, the Match Committee will only provide a reasonable extension of time in which Players/Teams will have to complete their Match Play round.
 - iv. The Match Committee will not force any Player/Team to play on any specific day.
 - v. In the situation whereby the Players/Teams still cannot agree on a date and time to play their Match Play round, refer to point (i) above.

To be played off the Blue Plates

- 1st Round to be completed no later than 16th November 2025.
- 2nd Round to be completed no later than 30th November 2025.

 - B Grade (18 holes) Tee Time 10:00am

NOTE: Dates for the Club Match Play Championships will be displayed on the Notice Board approximately two weeks before the commencement of the 1st round of the Club Championships. Each round must be played on or before the date set down by the Match Committee.

TIES & COUNTBACKS

Please refer to the Major Events listed below and the Countback / Tie System in place in the event of 2 or more equal scores. A member of the Golf Committee should be available to assist the Pro Shop with results.

THE COUNTBACK SYSTEM – GENERAL PROCEDURE

The following general procedure is adopted when deciding results by count back for all competitions including Monthly Medals, Medal of Medals, normal Midweek and Saturday competitions etc unless otherwise stated.

Total of scores recorded on score card as follows:

- Last Round (if playing a multi-round competition) then,
- Last nine holes then,
- Last six holes then,
- Last three holes then,
- Hole by hole until results are decided, commencing from 18th hole.

LEONAY OPEN (BEST SCRATCH SCORE)

- Sudden Death Play-Off System using Holes 1, 2 and 18 until a result is achieved.
- Players involved in a tie are required to be present and available to contest the Sudden Death Play-Off, otherwise the player will forfeit.
- In the unlikely event that none of the tied players are available to compete in the Play-Off, then the General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

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RAY DUKES CUP (BEST SCRATCH SCORE)

- Sudden Death Play-Off System using Holes 1, 2 and 18 until a result is achieved.
- Players involved in a tie are required to be present and available to contest the Sudden Death Play-Off, otherwise the player will forfeit.
- In the unlikely event that none of the tied players are available to compete in the Play-Off, then the General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (BEST SCRATCH SCORE)

- 3 Hole best Aggregate Score Play Off System using Holes 1, 2 and 18 then,
- Sudden Death System using the same 3 holes until a result is achieved.
- Players involved in a tie are required to be present and available to contest the Sudden Death Play-Off, otherwise the player will forfeit.
- In the unlikely event that none of the tied players are available to compete in the Play-Off, then the General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP MATCHPLAY (NO HANDICAP)

- If after 18 holes the Match Play is square, a Sudden Death System recommencing from the 1st hole, then 2nd hole and so on until there is a winner.

AUTUMN CUP (BEST NETT INDIVIDUAL SCORE)

- The General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

PRESIDENTS SHIELD (BEST SCRATCH TEAM SCORE)

A four (4) Member team event, the three (3) best scratch scores are used for team result.

- Total of scores recorded on score card from the player with the 3rd best score recorded (18 holes) will be used, then using that particular players score card,
- The General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

NEPEAN RIVER BOWL (BEST NETT TEAM SCORE)

A four (4) Member team event, the three (3) best nett scores are used for team result.

- Total of scores recorded on score card from the player with the 3rd best score recorded (18 holes) will be used, then using that particular players score card,
- The General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP (BEST SCRATCH SCORE)

- 3 Hole best Aggregate Score Play Off System using Holes 1, 2 and 18 then,
- Sudden Death System using the same 3 holes until a result is achieved.
- Teams involved in a tie are required to be present and available to contest the Sudden Death Play-Off, otherwise the Team will forfeit.
- In the unlikely event that none of the tied Teams are available to compete in the Play-Off, then the General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted.

FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP MATCHPLAY (NO HANDICAP)

- If after 18 holes the Match Play is square, a Sudden Death System recommencing from the 1st hole, then 2nd hole and so on until there is a winner.

VETERAN POINTS SCORE CHALLENGE (STABLEFORD)

- The 3rd round of a players Top 3 Qualifying Results are used then,
- The General Procedure for Countbacks will be adopted using that 3rd round.

LEONAY GOLF CLUB CUPP (POINTS SYSTEM)

In the event that two or more players finish on the same highest points at the completion of this competition, joint winners will be declared and the prize money will be shared.

SPECIAL EVENTS

THE LEONAY GOLF CLUB CUPP - LGCC

The Leonay Golf Club Cupp is an annual competition starting in August and finishing in July the following year. Every Monthly Medal round, the top twenty nett scores from each grade receive points (points table is on the golf website) and these points are accumulated throughout the year until the final round, which is the July Monthly Medal. The LGCC is open to all 7-day golfing members and sponsored by Leonay Golf Club.

LAST MEMBER STANDING – LMS

Last Member Standing is open to all Leonay Golfing members with a current Golf Australia Handicap. From February to September each year all registered players' stableford scores from Thursday and Saturday competition rounds go towards Last Member Standing qualification.

- Registration is through the Pro Shop and Entry Fee is \$30.00.
- Qualification Starts from Saturday 1st February 2025.
- Qualification Finishes on Saturday 27th September 2025.
- Qualifying scores from Thursday and Saturday competitions only.
- Lady Golfers are welcome to qualify and compete.
- Scores made before the Entry Fee is paid are not valid.
- Final is Sunday 9th November 2025 at 9am. As Last Member Standing is a type of Match Play event, practice will be allowed on the Course on the day.

Last Member Standing (LMS) shirts are provided for participants in the Final. Qualifiers who withdraw prior to the ordering of LMS shirts will result in forfeiture of the entry fee and an LMS shirt will not be provided. Reserves called up to replace Qualifiers who withdraw will be included in the field but they will only receive an LMS shirt IF called up prior to the ordering of LMS shirts.

VETERAN POINTS SCORE CHALLENGE

Veteran Points Score Challenge is annual stableford event played on a Monday over five rounds from October to November with the best 3 scores counted.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- Entrant must be a financial member of Leonay Golf Club in one of the following categories:
 - Full Male / Lady Membership or,
 - Senior Male / Senior Lady Membership
- Must be a financial member for 3 months prior to the start of the Veteran Points Score Challenge.
- Must have attained the age of fifty (50) years on or prior to the first round of the event.
- Member must hold a valid Golf Australia Handicap, with no less than 5 individual cards submitted in the 12 months prior to the event.

NOTE: Application can be made to the Match Committee prior to the event if extraordinary circumstances prevent a member complying.

Entrant must remain a financial member of the club for the duration of the event.

The event will be conducted over five rounds with the members' best 3 rounds counting. In the event of one or more rounds being abandoned, the best 3 scores recorded in the rounds played will count.

TIES

In the event of two or more players returning equal scores in a competition, the winner shall be decided as follows:

1. Play-off in all Championships. Play-off over 18 holes, if still tied, hole for hole.
2. Medal of Medals Play-off over 18 holes, if still tied, as many 18-hole play-offs as are necessary to achieve a result.
3. Medal Qualifiers. Joint winners.

Club Monthly Medals and all other events to be decided by countback unless otherwise specified.

STARTING TIMES

Members are requested to report to the starter 15 minutes before their hit-off time; otherwise, they may lose their place and may be sent to the end of the field or may incur a penalty (suspension or disqualification) as the Match Committee may decide. The times placed on the Starters Sheet by members will be accepted and adopted by the Match Committee as the official starting times i.e., THE TIME LAID DOWN BY THE MATCH COMMITTEE. Any member who fails to attend in accordance with their starting time may be DISQUALIFIED in accordance with RULE 6 -3 of the Rules of Golf.

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HOUSE RULES

Members are expected to take pride in their Club regarding dress and conduct generally and to assist in the observance of the by-laws of the Leonay Golf Club.

HANDICAPS

All Ladies Members and Visitors handicaps to be 45 maximum.

COMPLAINTS

All complaints must be made in writing to the Secretary of the Golf Club who will submit them to the meeting of the Golf Club Committee.

PROTESTS

All protests or disputes in connection with a competition or match shall be submitted in writing within 15 minutes of the completion of the round to the Captain, Secretary, or other member of the match committee.

RIGHT OF THE COURSE

The President and Captain shall have the right of the course at any time should they desire to exercise that privilege.

MATCH COMMITTEE

The Match Committee reserves the right to alter the programme, Grades and other conditions of play or competition rules at any time prior to, or during competition if those alterations do not interfere or conflict with the Rules of Golf.

- Stroke - Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicap.
- Stableford - Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicap.
- Par - Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicap.

- Ambrose - see Table Below.

MIXED FOURSOMES RULE

Out of Bounds or Lost Tee Shot Rule at Leonay Golf Club.

Regardless of gender, if a ball is deemed to be lost or hit out of bounds from the tee box, the ball must be re-hit from the original tee markers with the appropriate penalty taken, with the playing partner playing the next shot.

STROKE EVENTS INCLUDING MEDAL ROUNDS

The score of each hole is recorded on the Scorecard provided. At the end of play this is calculated with the player's handicap deducted.

Almost all Members' competitions are open events. However, visitors, including honorary members from reciprocal clubs, cannot win a Championship or a Medal. If a visitor wins a Medal Round they will be awarded with the appropriate prize, but the medal itself will be awarded to the most successful member according to the rules for this competition.

A Fraction of Combined Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicaps (see below)

- Standard or Mixed Foursomes $1/2 \times$ Combined
- Canadian or American Foursomes $3/8 \times$ Combined

AMBROSE

A Fraction of Combined Full Stroke G.A. Daily Handicaps (see below)

- 2 players $1/4 \times$ Combined
- 3 players $1/6 \times$ Combined
- 4 players $1/8 \times$ Combined

**Minimum 3 drives
each player.**

NOTE: When playing Ambrose events, each player MUST have a minimum number of their tee-shots used and recorded on the score card, failure to do so will result in disqualification.
