<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Computing- coding</u></p> <div style="display: flex; flex-wrap: wrap;"> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Event</b></p> <p>An occurrence that causes a block of code to be run. The event could be the result of user action such as the user pressing a key (<b>when Key</b>) or clicking or swiping the screen (<b>when Clicked, when Swiped</b>) or when objects interact (collision). In 2Code, the event commands are used to create blocks of code that are run when events happen.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Function</b></p> <p>A block or sequence of code that you can access when you need it, so you don't have to rewrite the code repeatedly. Instead, you simply 'call' the function each time you want it.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Input</b></p> <p>Information going into the computer. This could be the user moving or clicking the mouse, or the user entering characters on the keyboard. On tablets there are other forms such as finger swipes, touch gestures and tilting the device.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Object</b></p> <p>Items in a program that can be given instructions to move or change in some way (action). In 2Code Gorilla, the <b>object types</b> are button number, input, text, shape turtle, character, object, vehicle, animal.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Output</b></p> <p>Information that comes out of the computer e.g. sound, prompt, alert or print to screen.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Repeat</b></p> <p>This command can be used to make a block of commands run a set number of times, until a condition is met or forever.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Nesting</b></p> <p>When coding commands are put inside other commands. These commands only run when the outer command runs.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Properties</b></p> <p>These determine the look and size of an object. Each object has properties such as the image, scale and position of the object.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Sequence</b></p> <p>This is when a computer program runs commands in order.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Physical System</b></p> <p>In this context, this is any object or situation that can be analysed and modelled. For example modelling the function of a traffic light, modelling friction of cars moving down surfaces or modelling the functions of a home's security system.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Selection</b></p> <p>A conditional decision command. When selection is used, a program will choose which bit of code to run depending on a condition. In 2Code selection is accomplished using <b>'if'</b> or <b>'if/else'</b> statements.</p> </div> <div style="width: 33%;"> <p><b>Simplify</b></p> <p>In coding this is used to describe modifying the code to complete the same process with less lines of code.</p> </div> </div> <p><small>Need more support?
