LISTENING SESSIONS

Listening sessions with both teachers and students is an invaluable tool for receiving honest feedback about a school's relationship to Student Voice culture and potential for further development.

Teacher Listening Sessions

Listening sessions help principals and school leaders collect honest, constructive feedback from teachers. When teachers feel unheard or unclear about their role, it can undermine efforts to build a positive, student-centered school culture.

Student Listening Sessions

The Student Listening Sessions Protocol offers a structured way to gather student feedback. It creates a safe space for students to share their views on school culture and their role in it. When ready, students can also **lead** listening sessions with their peers.
