Attendance Agreement

At Brigshaw Learning Partnership, we believe that every child has the right to a high-quality education and the best possible chance to succeed. Regular attendance and punctuality are essential for ensuring children thrive – academically, socially, and emotionally.

Why attendance matters - There are three key reasons why regular attendance is a priority across all our schools:

- 1. **Every child has the right to a full-time education**. It is both a legal entitlement and a shared responsibility between families, schools, and the local authority.
- 2. **Attendance is a key driver of achievement**. Pupils who are regularly in school are more likely to reach their potential.
- 3. **Developing good habits for life**. Regular attendance builds discipline, resilience, and a strong foundation for future education, employment, and wellbeing.

What are my responsibilities as a parent/carer?

Under Section 7 of the Education Act 1996, parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure children attend school regularly and on time. In addition, it's a legal requirement for parents and carers to notify the school on each day of their child's absence, providing a reason for the absence. By law, schools have to report attendance to relevant authorities and failure to meet these responsibilities can result in legal action being taken by the local authority.

Our shared expectations - As part of our partnership, we ask families to commit to the following:

Daily attendance and punctuality

- I will ensure my child attends school every day and arrives on time.
- I understand that if my child is late, they may receive a sanction unless there is medical evidence of an appointment or other exceptional circumstances.
- I will inform the school each day my child is absent. Upon return from illness, I will provide medical evidence where possible.

Medical appointments

- I will make appointments outside of school hours wherever possible.
- Where unavoidable, I will provide evidence of appointments in advance.
- If an appointment is during the school day, I will ensure my child attends before and/or after the appointment.

Term-time holidays

• I accept that holidays during term time will not be authorised. I accept that unauthorised absence may result in further action in line with local authority procedures, including Fixed Penalty Notices.

We are proud of the strong relationships we build with families across the Brigshaw Learning Partnership. Supporting your child to attend regularly is one of the most important ways we can work together to secure their future success. If you are experiencing difficulty in supporting your child's attendance, please contact your school as early as possible – we are here to help.
