Across Osaka Bay, and very close by, lies Kobe; a delightful port city scenically situated between the

mountains and the sea with a rich maritime history. The city centre is home to a wonderful old Chinatown - borne of Kobe' status as a major trading port. We will meet our highly recommended local guide who will bring our day's sightseeing to life. We will visit the Kitano area where many foreign traders and diplomats settled in the 19th century, and where, today, many of the beautiful old western homes have been preserved, and are open to the public. We will take a cable car ride (quaintly referred to as a ropeway in Japan) up Mt Rokko to the beautiful Nunobiki herb garden. A visit to a famous sake brewery will end the day's sightseeing. No visit to Kobe is complete without a meal of its famous Kobe marbled beef, and we will enjoy dinner at a local restaurant, before returning to Osaka.

Kurashiki is renowned for its locally produced denim and canvas, and there are many shops selling denim in particular. During our visit we will enjoy a relaxing canal ride on a punt.

The remainder of the day is yours to settle in and enjoy our new surroundings, before a casual dinner in the evening.



Today's excursion (with a local guide) is to the quaint seaside town s of Kamakura and Enoshima, just an hour from Tokyo by train. Kamakura is beautifully located between lush green hills and the coast. This very old town is often referred to as "Kyoto of the East" and has often played an important role in Japanese history. Today it is a popular place for "upper class retirement"! Fun fact: In 1250, Kamakura was the fourth largest city in the world. We will take a ride on the cute little "toy train" along the coast to the surfing island town of Enoshima, enjoying the fun as our train actually travels along the main street. If time permits, we will take a ride on the Shonan "hanging" monorail. This evening we will enjoy a farewell dinner as we begin to think about returning home.

Confirmation of your booking

When we receive your booking form and deposit we will immediately dispatch confirmation of your place on the tour. From this time a firm contract exists between you and Ramsgate Travel on the basis of our tour flyer and any amendments communicated to you.

What is included in the tour price?

Your tour price includes all arrangements as outlined in the daily itinerary inclusive of accommodation, transportation, admission fees, hotel porterage of one suitcase per person and services of a Ramsgate Travel throughout. Meals are included according to the legend as shown beside each day's activities; any additional meals are at your own expense and payable direct at that time. If you are traveling alone, an accommodation single surcharge will apply.

What is not included in the tour price?

Air fares (only if indicated) passport and visa fees, excess baggage, insurances of all kinds, laundry, phone calls, additional accommodation made necessary by flight schedules, additional meals and beverages not already stated as included, optional excursions and sightseeing not included in the itinerary, and items of a personal nature, and necessary COVID 19 related expenses e.g. PCR tests.

This means your passport should be valid for at least 6 months from your scheduled return to Australia.

It is your responsibility to obtain vaccinations and preventative medicines as may be required for the duration of your travel.

It is your responsibility to ensure that you are in possession of the necessary documentation to comply with the laws and regulations of the destinations to be visited. You should consult your GP or a specialist travel medical practitioner at least 8 weeks prior to travel. We will not be responsible for any loss you incur if you are denied boarding or entry to a destination because you do not have necessary documentation or records of vaccinations.

Fitness

This tour requires a degree of fitness and stamina.

If you cancel or alter your booking

Our tour operator will levy a charge if you cancel once the confirmation has been issued, to offset costs incurred in preparation of the tour.

Charges vary according to the period of notice given - (fees are per person).

Up to 91 days before departure - loss of deposit.

Between 90 and 62 days before departure - 50% of tour cost.

Less than 61 days before departure - 100% of total tour cost.

Host
