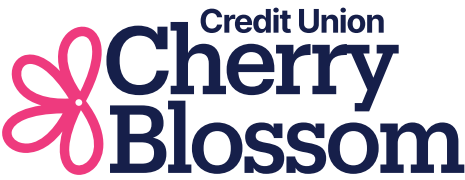

In 2002, a small group of credit unions joined together as title sponsors of the annual Cherry Blossom Run in Washington, DC to raise funds for Children’s National Medical Center. Those credit unions became Credit Union Miracle Day Inc.

Over the last 25 years, Credit Union Miracle Day has grown to include over 70 credit union and industry sponsors from around the country partnering as title sponsors of the Credit Union Cherry Blossom, which is comprised of the signature 10 mile run, 5K and Kids Run. Credit Union Cherry Blossom weekend draws runners and volunteers from all over the USA, over half of which are credit union members.

Together these credit unions raise funds for Children’s Miracle Network while demonstrating the cooperative nature of our movement and the impact credit unions make in their local communities.

ANNUAL CAPITOL HILL COMPETITION

The annual Capitol Hill Competition is the race within the Credit Union Cherry Blossom 10 Mile & 5K. For 28 years and counting, Congressional Federal Credit Union, United States Federal Credit Union and America’s Credit Unions have teamed up to guarantee entries for members of Congress and staff. Each year members of Congress are invited to sign up as Honorary Race Chairs of the Credit Union Cherry Blossom. All Honorary Race Chairs are given a special wall plaque to display outside of their office doors on Capitol Hill.

CHC Teams compete for bragging rights and the coveted Congressional Cup. CHC have their own separate registration process, packet pickup and special CHC race shirts.

In 2026 over 1,000 Hill and agency staffers and members of Congress ran in the 10 mile, 5K or Double Blossom (both the 10 mile & 5K).
