- 3) Testing progress update presentation submitted to the VO-12 point of contact containing a status description of testing activities and any relevant images (a virtual meeting may also be requested by VO-12 program staff; and
- 4) Submission of a Project Summary Report to the VO-12 point of contact containing a summary of the project objectives, methods, results, discussion, and attachments with relevant data. Raw test data will be provided in accordance with the Voucher IP Plan. Templates will be provided via the VO-12 Website. Milestone 3 should be completed at 50-75% into the project timeline and Milestone 4 must be completed within one calendar year of the project start date. Payments for the voucher program are made based on these 4 milestones and are paid to the Voucher Provider. Voucher Recipients are not eligible for any funding. Payment date is Net 30 from successfully completed Invoice Date, with the Invoice Request including accurate details and all required documentation.
