What is the Australian Epilepsy Project?

The Australian Epilepsy Project (AEP) is a large scale research study which seeks to better understand epilepsy and seizures, through advanced testing. It combines advanced magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), neuropsychological assessments (such as memory and language tests), and genetic testing to advance research in epilepsy diagnosis and treatment. The advanced testing involved in the AEP is not widely available in standard clinical care and may be useful in helping researchers to better understand and treat epilepsy.

Please ask your neurologist for a referral to the AEP.

What tests are performed?






Advanced MRI Scan

MRI brain scans generate images of the brain and are widely used in medicine. During AEP testing, advanced imaging, including structural and functional MRI will be performed to investigate brain shape, processing irregularities, or other conditions which may be relevant to seizures.

The study team and radiographer will follow clear protocols including reviewing your medical history and other safety requirements. Whilst undergoing MRI scanning, you will be asked to look at words and patterns on a screen, and think about whether or not they rhyme or match, as well as complete a visual memory task.

Neuropsychology


Neuropsychological testing involves assessment of thinking (cognitive) skills including memory, attention, concentration, and language use.

The testing will take place through a telehealth appointment. Your assessor will ask you questions and guide you through on-screen tasks.

Additionally, you will complete questionnaires about your health and well-being.

Genetics

The AEP will send you a saliva sample kit. This is a genetic test to screen for uncommon genetic conditions and understand if a genetic abnormality is contributing to the cause of your epilepsy.

Alternatively this can be arranged on the same day as your advanced MRI.

The results will be included in the AEP report.
