# **Supporter Sentiment Survey**

October 2025



# Overview

The survey was distributed by email to the WATR Mailing List on Wednesday 22nd October and closed for entries on Sunday 26th October 2025.

The intent was to quickly capture supporter sentiment towards the club and the Rovers Trust 'WATR', so that we could use this information to inform and guide our decision making going forwards as we focus on growing our membership numbers, alongside trying to best represent the wider Blackburn Rovers fan base.

The survey focused on 9 key areas with the majority being multiple choice, in order to use this as a benchmark going forwards.


The results are presented on the following slides and where relevant, broken down to show the overall picture and the sentiment of Trust membership.



# **Findings**

We received a total of 361 responses, of with 217 confirmed that they were current members of the Trust.\*

Are you currently a Trust member? 361 responses






<sup>\*</sup>Despite some admission of multiple submissions, there is little evidence to suggest manipulation of the results.

# **Sentiment towards the Club**




#### How would you rate the priority of the below concerns?



It is evident from the results that the majority of the fanbase believe the greatest concerns lie within the Senior Leadership at the club. This is split evenly across the Owners (Venky's) and their representative (Suhail Pasha), with the lack of a CEO following behind.

The commercial aspect of the club appears to be of least priority, however the results still suggest many opportunities lie within this area.

# Would you like to see new Owners of the Football Club?




Over 90% of the fanbase surveyed would like to see a change in ownership of Blackburn Rovers Football Club, with a strong correlation between trust and non-trust members.

Only 1.1% (4) voted against the idea of new ownership with 6.6% (24) saying they would be unsure.




Do you believe that the people in charge at Rovers (Suhail Pasha, Rudy Gestede etc.) are committed to the clubs success?



The majority do not believe that those in charge of the day-to-day running of the Football Club, are committed to the long-term success, with only 10% (36) of overall respondents suggesting that they do believe in the local leadership's commitment.



# Based on your answer to the previous question; who would you say is more responsible for this?



Following the vast majority of belief being that the club would be relegated, the majority of respondents believe blame for this lies directly with the owners, with just below 40% placing responsibility with the local leadership at Ewood Park.

The remaining 8.9% (32) selected 'Other' with 62.5% (20) of those suggesting equal accountability and the remainder alluding to a combination of outside factors/interference and underqualified decision makers.

# What approach would you most like to see from the Trust moving forwards?



The sentiment across members and non-members is almost identical, with the majority supporting the Trust in backing protests against the current stewardship of the club.

It appears that there is strong support for all of the recommended actions to be taken, suggesting that our discussions are primarily pointed in the right directions and a more visible presence of our actions may be welcomed.

# Which of the following would you like to see more of from the Trust?



Supporters were able to select multiple options for this question, along with being able to make their own suggestions. There were

The majority of other respondents highlighted a combination of 2, or more, of the items above - suggesting that our main focus areas are primarily around communication with the fanbase (members and non-members).

22 respondents selected 'Other' and left comments to share their thoughts.

# If you are not a member of the Trust, what would make you consider joining?

This question was the only free-text and non-mandatory question, aimed to understand in more detail what could be done to increase the numbers of WATR membership. 24.6% (89) of respondents left comments in this section.

The common themes here are focused around communication and visibility of the actions and discussions we take as a Trust/Board, with a handful of comments stating that they used to be members but left for a number of different reasons including; age, lack of engagement/understanding or disagreeing with the direction of the Trust.

Some comments do mention not being sure of how to sign-up, or renew existing membership, which could be linked to payment issues that have been discussed previously and highlight a possible need to make this easier and/or more visible through any shared media.

# Which of the following would you like to see more of from the Trust? (page 1/2)

No idea

You are doing nothing

PROTEST PROTEST

Public protest through the mainstream media and targeting India

# Which of the following would you like to see more of from the Trust? (part 2/2)

Better leadership and action from the Trust; why have we got two Chairmen - I didn't vote for it and {redacted} is just in it for himself?

An acknowledgment that the trust is not the most important nor the only valid voice of the fanbase.

If we wanted to crowdsource something like signs or color boards for a message, I'd be interested in that. I understand the trusts funds aren't really a massive account, but with organizing and planning being such a huge time commitment,

I know I and hopefully others would pitch in a few guid for supplies/permitting etc.

# If you are not a member of the Trust, what would make you consider joining? (page 1/6)

The Trust pivoting towards campaigning for majority fan ownership of all Football League and Premier League clubs in England.

I feel closer to the Norwegian supporter club.

More understanding of how things works, don't live locally

Actually doing something!!!! As a supporters group you're totally inept.

Updates on how the trust is holding the club to account and more presence and a plan on how to move the club forward

Free membership

Be instrumental in rooting out the cancerous forces that are destroying Blackburn Rovers

A sense that by joining it would genuinely make a difference

I believe I was a member once, and I was never ever contacted about renewing etc, I contacted someone on X who never got back to me ...no communication from club nor supporters trust

Unfortunately I live in Surrey. If I still lived in Blackburn I would be a season ticket holder and would feel more involved.

Also, I am 76 years old and not able to drive up and back in a day as I did years ago, but I have supported Rovers since the 1950's....when I lived near Griffin park!

If the heat was going to be massively turned up on the Venky representatives. Just feels too comfortable for them to carry on doing what they are doing.

Every attempt to get rid of suhail, rudy & adam owen

Actions. I understand this is difficult, but until WATR shows some results and/or proof of impact, it feels like just another set of fans who are expressing the common concerns.



### If you are not a member of the Trust, what would make you consider joining? (page 2/6)

£1 membership fee.

The 'Pie and a Pint' argument often used against the club regarding ticket prices also works here.

Lower fee = more members and therefore a stronger mandate that comes with representing a greater section of the fanbase. 1000 @£10 or 10,000 at £1? Worked for the York City Supporters Trust when they tried it.

Visible WATR support of a Protest & call to action

A complete change of ownership of BRFC. The Trust at present has no effect,

Sadly apathy whilst Venkys remain

Assurance that the main focus of the Trust is removing the owners and board as that is the most pressing issue at our club.

Visibility of actually doing something active

I'd like to know more

A belief that you could exert any kind of influence

Clearer visibility with the fanbase as you come across as a closed shop that pandered around for individuals within the club to get a small chew on the bone. The memorandum of understanding was a waste of time and now holds no real weight with the club at all.

The fact there are so many splinter groups speaks volumes about your group that it does not represent the real fanbase as a whole and until it becomes as it claims a community fans group and drops the daft £10 charge it won't ever be a real force as it should be our lows should not be your profits and by the way do you show your accounts from subscribers?

If so fine but overall no chance I'd join till you became more visible and have real meaningful dialogue with the club about the real issues the fanbase have.



### If you are not a member of the Trust, what would make you consider joining? (page 3/6)

I need to know more about your work/purpose and objectives in a clear way and that unity amongst fans/fan groups is prioritised so we are all in one direction.

The commercial ticket pricing structure from the club is horrendous. Take fans ideas forward on this to the contact opportunities you have with the club.

More active engagement against the owners

More prolonged action instead of on and off

Fallen out of love with the club a bit during the last two years. Season ticket holder previously. I'm sure my enthusiasm to attend games will return and then I'll join. I was secretary of the now defunct South Lancs Branch some years ago so I know all about commitment. I was a Season Ticket holder for 20 odd years. When I didn't renew there was no contact from the club. Felt a bit disappointed to be honest. Taken for granted perhaps.

A cheap entry point and zoom meetings online, because i live 25 miles away

More visibility and more action instead of just statements. The trust needs to galvanise the supporters into action, whether that be raising awareness, managing fanbase wide protests or ensuring the voice of fans beyond trust members are heard.

It was a simple cost reason, I could not afford, perhaps pay monthly memberships are an option

If i felt like it was achieving something constructive, I might. But that doesn't seem to be the case, quite possibly because of the broken relationship with the owners.

The Trust needs to be more visible and active.

If it looked like it would make an impact.

I would only be able to join at a distance.

I have lost a lot of interest in the club.
