## 1,217


### ADULT CLIENTS

Including 201 National Redress clients. SASS also supported people through 36 Police Statements and 39 Forensic Medical Examinations.



SASS partnered with a number of Tasmanian Government services and Laurel House to pilot a 'multidisciplinary' service delivery model in Hobart and Launceston. Arch launched in 2023 to provide a coordinated and collaborative, trauma-informed services for victim-survivors in Tasmania.

### SASS REFERRALS HAVE DOUBLED SINCE 2020






