TECHNICAL DELEGATE LICENSE COURSE

1. Course Overview

The Professional Taekwondo Federation (PTF) Technical Delegate License Program for Championships is designed to establish the highest standard for managing and overseeing Kombat Taekwondo competitions at national and international levels. This elite certification equips Technical Delegates with comprehensive theoretical knowledge and practical expertise necessary to organize, supervise, and ensure the integrity and highest quality of Kombat Taekwondo championships.

2. Administration

The overall administration of the KT Technical Delegate Certification Course shall be managed by the Professional Taekwondo Federation (PTF) in cooperation with the KT Membership System (KTMS). All participants who successfully complete the course will receive a certification from the Professional Taekwondo Federation.

3. Certification

- The PTF will grant certification to Technical Delegates who have successfully attended the PTF Technical Delegate Certification Course and have passed the required examinations conducted by PTF.
- The PTF recognizes valid Taekwondo instructor certifications issued by accredited Taekwondo organizations. Eligible instructors may enroll in the PTF Technical Delegate License Program to obtain an equivalent certification within the PTF framework.

4. Qualifications for Applicants

4.1 National Technical Delegate License (Level I)

- Be a registered member of the KTMS.
- Hold a minimum 3rd Dan Black Belt in recognized Taekwondo organization.
- Have successfully completed a KT Referee Seminar before attending the course.
- Minimum 30 years of age.

4.2 International Events Technical Delegate License (Level II)

- Be a registered member of the KTMS.
- Hold a minimum 4th Dan Black Belt in recognized Taekwondo organization.
- Have successfully completed a KT Referee Seminar before attending the course.
- Proficiency in spoken and written English.
- Possess a valid passport and be able to travel internationally.

4.3 General Information

- The PTF will appoint the lecturers for the course.
- Course Format: Online or In-Person (16 Hours / 2 Days).
- Registration Fee:
 - Level I: \$300
 - Level II: \$500
- **Registration Process:** Participants must register via the KTMS system.
- PTF will not provide financial support (airfare, accommodation, etc.) unless specified in the KTMS system.
- **Evaluation:**
 - Written Test: Conducted in English.
 - Minimum Passing Score: 70 points (Level I), 80 points (Level II).
 - Practical Performance Evaluation to ensure competency in championship management and technical supervision.

5. Eligibility for Technical Delegate (TD) Appointment

5.1 Level I - PTF Technical Delegate Certificate Holders May Officiate

- May manage all KT Minor & Major League championships and Kombat Taekwondo Challenge Series that do not feature international fighters.

5.2 Level II - PTF Technical Delegate Certificate Holders May Officiate

- KT Grand Prix events.
- Kombat Taekwondo Challenge Series on a global scale.
- World Title Belt Championships.
- World Open International Championships.

6. PTF Technical Delegate Refresher Course

- Conducted as needed to update Technical Delegate on amended rules and procedures.
- Certified KT TDs must attend a Refresher Course within two years to renew their certification.
- Registration Fee: Determined in the KTMS system before each course.
- Certification renewal upon successful completion of the Refresher Course.

7. Certification Validation

- The PTF TD Certificate is valid for 48 months.
- Validity starts from PTF Issuance Date.
- Certification is automatically revoked if a refresher course is not attended within 12 months.
- No annual membership fee required.
- Certification may be restored by attending and passing another KT TD Certification Course.

8. Duties of a Certified PTF Technical Delegate

- Abide by all PTF & KT rules and regulations.
- Act with dignity, honor, integrity, and professionalism.
- Stay updated on the latest PTF rules, regulations, and policies.
- Maintain accurate contact information in KTMS.

9. Disciplinary Measures

- PTF reserves the right to impose disciplinary actions, including warnings, rebukes, suspension, or certification revocation for misconduct, in accordance with PTF regulations.

10. Enforcement

- These regulations come into effect on June 1, 2025.
- Only certified PTF Technical Delegates may officiate KT-sanctioned competitions.
