The **rare Charitable Research Reserve** has partnered with Cambridge & North Dumfries Community Foundation, Ages Foundation Fund to financially assist students in pursuit of higher education as they tackle important environmental issues. The Research Fellowship & Bursaries program will allow students to study at a relatively undisturbed, yet highly accessible site in Waterloo Region/Wellington. Applications that utilize multiple knowledge systems and diverse methodologies will be prioritized. The monetary awards will help ensure successful candidates have the necessary resources to conduct and report on their research at **rare**.

We support diverse, inclusive and equitable practices and approaches to environmental issues as we work toward meaningful reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples (self-identified and status First Nations, Métis & Inuit) of Turtle Island. We encourage applications from Indigenous students utilizing Indigenous and/or Western knowledge systems and methodologies.

### Eligibility:

- **Must be enrolled as a graduate student in a Canadian or International institution.**
- **Research or project must occur at least in part between 2025 and 2026**
- **Research must be environment-focused and/or land-based and should utilize *rare* as a field site, case study or another form of partnership.**
