We are a community-driven land trust and environmental research institute based in Cambridge, Ontario. We welcome diverse forms of inquiry that contribute to environmental conservation, research and education. **Eligible projects must have an environmental focus and will utilize rare as a field site, case study or in some other capacity.**

Completion of this application and receipt of a permit from **rare** is required before any project work begins. Applications are welcome year-round. Applications are reviewed to ensure they fall within the scope of **rare's** mandate and to minimize the risk of harm to the environment. Additional information may be requested as needed. We recommend that you submit applications at least four weeks in advance of your anticipated start date to allow sufficient time for review and revision, if required.
