Autism Information Line

- » A tool for Autistic people of all ages to navigate their daily routines.

Employment and Post-18 Transitions

- Our Employment Programme supports Autistic jobseekers through group or 1:1 sessions on CV development, job search and mock interviews. Contact employmentgroups@asiam.ie for more information.

National Supports Department

- » The National Supports Department creates safe and empowering spaces for Autistic individuals and their families.
- » AsIAm National Support programmes offer a variety of social, activity-based, and wellbeing groups and events for Autistic children and adults. Additionally, these programmes provide educational and advocacy support for families, along with individualised support and guidance on AAC communication devices.

- » AsIAm's Policy team works to advance the rights of Ireland's Autism community by advocating for the full implementation and resourcing of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.
