Jimarion Arthur 2024 vs 2025



Players in Louisiana Division 1 football know Arthur's name and are not looking forward to seeing him again. His Senior year will mark his third year of significant playing time at the varsity level and he's made his presence felt the last two seasons; making 40 tackles (9th on team) with 1 interception his sophomore year and 36 tackles (7th on team), 2 TFLs, 3 INT (led team) and 5 PDs (3rd on team). Paving the way for the Airline Vikings to lead Louisiana in interceptions in 2025. Arthur shows his versatility in the roles he's asked to play. He lined up at split safety and outside CB playing off and press-bail technique, and was able to make an impact at all three, though he flashed the most at safety and off ball CB. Arthur's driving trait on the backside is his eyes, very evident in his shuffle technique at CB. He snapshots between the routes and QB very well and has a solid understanding of route concepts, allowing him to consistently be in the right place to make a play. He adds a great trigger, good burst, and great long speed, showing the capability to jump or drive down on routes. Arthur plays above his weight class in the run as well, relishing the opportunity to make a big hit on ball carriers near the line of scrimmage. He is not afraid to get dirty near the line and takes good pursuit angles as well, not taking himself out of plays. Arthur isn't only a playmaker on the defensive side of the ball either, showing his electric athleticism on jet sweep and YAC opportunities. He made the most of these opportunities, hauling in 6 catches for 179 yards (29.8 avg!), showing off shiftiness and creativity in the open field. This is a player that has the eyes and athleticism to fit well in any zone-heavy scheme as a split safety, nickel, or off ball corner.
