Innovative residential typologies create a beautiful, safe, green, convivial neighbourhood. St George's attractive, verdant public realm will be not just for residents but for the whole city. Independent, local enterprises enliven the quarter, spilling out onto St George's open spaces, activating ground floors and welcoming a wider public. The church becomes permeable, the heart of the new community.

The development will be a low carbon, resilient, circular economy exemplar, a showcase for sustainable construction and sustainable living. This is just the start. We want to develop our proposals hand in hand with the people of Wolverhampton. And why Woven Hampton? Wolverhampton's industrial history includes textiles. Our proposals aim to weave the church and its new neighbourhood together, creating new threads and connections, stitching and rebonding separated areas of Wolverhampton, enriching the city's fabric, helping to create a new urban tapestry.
