Introduction

Arizona is home to a rapidly growing and increasingly complex nonprofit sector, with more than 30,000 registered nonprofits serving communities across the state. From Phoenix and Scottsdale to Tucson, Flagstaff, Yuma, and rural and tribal communities, Arizona nonprofits operate in a landscape shaped by fast population growth, economic diversity, and significant geographic scale.

In 2026, Arizona nonprofits are navigating:

The Best Fundraising Strategies for Arizona Nonprofits in 2026

Multi-Channel Fundraising Is Essential in a Fast-Growth State

- Extreme heat season (May–Sept): Safety and emergency response fundraising

- Year-end (Nov–Dec): Peak giving season

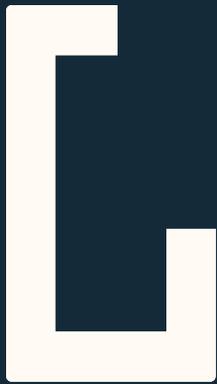


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
