Reception visited Gibside Woods in relation to the taught theme of 'Twigs and Sticks.' The children enjoyed creating woodland dens and drinking hot chocolate before going on a leaf hunt to identify which trees could be found in the woods. The children then made 'Stick Man' inspired artwork with materials they found on the visit.

Year 1 visited the Discovery Museum in Newcastle to take part in a workshop entitled 'Christmas in the Toy Museum.' The children were able to handle and examine a range of toys from different time periods and compare them to toys they play with themselves. The children also enjoyed listening to the story 'Lost in the Toy Museum' before taking home their own Victorian toy.

Year 2 visited the cenotaph at St Michael's Church in Houghton, as part of the 'Remembrance Day' history unit. The children discussed how and why soldiers and the emergency services are remembered before acting out their own remembrance service. On return to school, the children wrote non-chronological reports about the history of Remembrance Day as well as creating some poppy inspired artwork.

Year 3 visited the Oriental Museum in Durham in relation to their history study of Ancient Egypt. The children took part in a workshop where they handled genuine Egyptian artefacts as well as learning the process of mumification. The children also studied the 'Weighing of the Heart' ceremony by taking part in a group role play activity.

Year 4 children visited the Hatton Art Gallery in Newcastle, where they were able to observe first-hand some famous pieces of modern art by Matt Rugg and Kurt Schwitters. The children used this as inspiration to then create their own artwork in a similar style to what they had studied closely around the recently refurbished gallery.

Year 5 visited The Great North Museum in Newcastle, in relation to the Science unit 'Earth and Space.' The children were amazed by the planetarium show, which took the them on a journey through the Solar System and beyond. The children then went on to take part in an Earth and Space related workshop within the museum, during which they developed their understanding of how life on Earth is influenced by space.

Year 6 visited SafetyWorks! in Newcastle, where they were impressed by the highly interactive safety centre. All of the children participated in a number of different real-life scenarios, all of which were specifically designed to develop personal safety awareness in realistic situations. Each of the different scenarios illustrated potential every day hazards and how best to prevent them from occurring including water safety with the RNLI, fire safety with the Tyne and Wear Fire Brigade, dealing with peer pressure with Northumbria Police as well as rail safety on the Tyne and Wear Metro.
