Pharmacology for Mental Health and Addictions

Course : MHA235

Course Hours: 56

This course introduces students to the foundational principles of pharmacology as they relate to mental health and addictions. Areas of study include basic neurobiology, the physiological basis of mental disorders including substance use disorders, and the core concepts of pharmacokinetics. Students will examine major classifications of drugs of abuse and psychotropic medications.

Throughout the course, students apply theoretical knowledge to analyze several diagnostic categories from the *DSM-5*. These include, but are not limited to, substance-related disorders, anxiety disorders, mood disorders, and psychotic disorders.

Experienced instructors will engage, mentor and support our students to achieve their education goals for new beginnings, supported by our D2L Brightspace learning management system for discussion posts, assignment submission, tests/quizzes. **Instructors will adhere to administrative requirements of Oshki-Wenjack and partner institutions.**

Oshki-Wenjack is committed to creating a diverse and inclusive environment and welcomes applications from all qualified individuals, Indigenous people, women, racialized persons, persons with disabilities and other equity-seeking groups.
