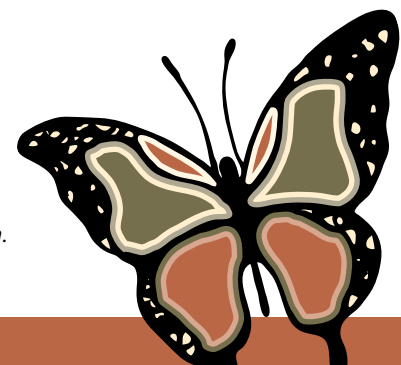


### *New Beginnings*

In partnership with Algoma University, Oshki-Wenjack now provides an accelerated, 2.3 year Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) degree program for students who already hold a college diploma with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Our unique cultural and community-based program offers a blended delivery model that enables students to stay within their home community for most of the program. Students will attend in-person, intensive blocks of learning on our Thunder Bay campus, along with online evening learning from their home communities. Our instructors are committed to a hands-on learning experience and an interactive learning environment. This BSW program has a particular focus on multi-cultural social work in and with northern, rural, remote, Indigenous, and Franco-Ontarian communities. Our program advocates for social justice and equips students with the intellectual, practical, and professional skills needed to promote the individual and collective well-being of individuals, families, groups, and communities. Field practicums provide hands on experience in a variety of settings.

Upon successful completion of the degree, graduates are eligible for registration with the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers and will be prepared to practice generalist, anti-oppressive social work at the entry level with diverse populations in a Canadian context.

## Program:

- 2.3-Year Degree Program (7 semesters)
- Field Practicum
- Typical Semester: 2-weeks on campus, 10-weeks online.

## Academic Requirements:

- Must have an overall average of 70% (G.P.A. of 3.00). With G.P.A. of 3.3, for a 3-year diploma, students could earn up to 60 transfer credits
- Graduates of the Social Service Worker (Indigenous Specialization) and Indigenous Wellness and Addictions Diploma Programs are preferred.

## Practicum Requirements:

- Current Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC)
- Up-to-date immunization including minimum two vaccinations for COVID-19

**NOTE:** Exact number of credits to be taken depends on transfer credits granted. Sequence of courses subject to change.
