In partnership with Algoma University, OSHKI-WENJACK provides an accelerated, 2.3-year Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) degree program for students who already hold a college diploma with a minimum G.P.A. of 3.0. Our unique cultural and community-based program offers a blended delivery model that enables students to stay within their home community for most of the program. Students will attend in-person, intensive blocks of learning on our Thunder Bay campus and online evening learning from their home communities. Our instructors are committed to a hands-on learning experience and an interactive learning environment. This B.S.W. program focuses on multi-cultural social work in and with northern, rural, remote, Indigenous, and Franco-Ontarian communities. Our program advocates for social justice and equips students with the intellectual, practical, and professional skills needed to promote the individual and collective well-being of individuals, families, groups, and communities. Field practicums provide hands-on experience in a variety of settings. Upon successfully completing the degree, graduates are eligible for registration with the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers. They will be prepared to practice generalist, anti-oppressive social work at the entry level with diverse populations in a Canadian context.

Mental Health Worker, Indigenous Rights Advocate, Indigenous Counsellor, Care Coordinator/Case Worker, Social Planner, Indigenous Outreach Worker, Community Developer, Family Services Worker, Community Worker, Policy Analyst/Advisor, Program Administrator, Employment Advisor, School/Medical Social Worker, etc.

NOTES: Exact number of credits to be taken depends on transfer credits granted. Sequence of and courses subject to change.

Admission:

Must have an overall average of 70% (3.0 G.P.A.). With a G.P.A. of 3.3, for a 3-year diploma, students could earn up to 60 transfer credits.

Graduates of the Social Service Worker (Indigenous Specialization) and Indigenous Wellness and Addictions Prevention Diploma Programs are preferred. Other diploma holders from similar programs are encouraged to apply.

7 Semesters:

- Field Practicum
- Typical Semester: 2 weeks on campus, 10 weeks online.

Practicum Requirements:

Most agencies require a current Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC).
