



2026 GALA FUNDING GOALS

The Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation (CHCF) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to expanding access to high-quality, affordable, and culturally competent health care for medically underserved communities across New York City.

Through our 2026 Annual Gala, CHCF raises critical funds to advance the following strategic priorities at the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center (CBWCHC):

- **Strengthen Special Clinical Programs and Enabling Services**

CHCF supports CBWCHC in addressing some of the most pressing health challenges facing Asian American immigrants and other underserved populations. With donor support, CBWCHC delivers approximately a dozen special programs and enabling services, offered for free or at low cost to patients and community members, including:

- **Cancer** screening and early detection
- **Hepatitis B** testing, treatment, and care
- **Maternity mental health** support services
- **Smoking** cessation education and counseling
- Comprehensive support for **special needs children and their families**

Together, these initiatives form a vital complement to CBWCHC's primary care services. Yet, despite their proven ability to improve health outcomes, many of these programs are underfunded or not reimbursed by insurance. Philanthropic investment is essential to sustaining these life-changing services for our community.

- **Build the Community Health Workforce of Tomorrow**

Project AHEAD (Asian Health Education and Development) is CBWCHC's flagship workforce development program and a powerful investment in the future of community health. This immersive summer **internship program** provides undergraduate students and recent graduates with hands-on training and mentorship. Since its launch, nearly 700 interns have gone on to pursue careers in health care, public health, and social services, making meaningful contributions to communities locally and globally. This program is entirely funded by private donations.

Additionally, CBWCHC provides **personalized mentorship, ongoing training, and leadership development opportunities** for staff and community members. With your generosity, we can inspire and nurture the next generation of compassionate, culturally competent health professionals.
