Engaging in Prayer for Frontline Missions



Saying ‘YES’ to the great commission as you pray

The great commission is a command given to the church by Jesus; in fact it was his final command to us. When he commissioned us to make disciples in all nations (people groups), he guaranteed we would see this come to fruition through the picture painted in Revelation of every tribe, tongue, people and nation worshipping Jesus around the throne of God.

We can walk in faith-filled obedience to Jesus’ commission by praying according to God’s desire to send laborers and work salvation among those who haven’t heard the gospel preached to them yet.

Engaging in this call to pray doesn’t have to be complicated. Use this guide to know what to pray and then find creative ways to regularly pray that God’s light would pierce the darkest corners of the globe. Here are some ideas to get you started!



Home Routines



Put the prayer guide on your fridge or mirror & use normal routine times like laundry, cooking, dishes or getting ready to pray for frontline teams.

Small Groups



Adopt a region as a small group & incorporate a time of prayer to consistently pray for God to work salvation through the teams laboring in that region.

With a Friend



Set a weekly coffee & prayer date with a friend. It can be as easy as picking up the phone or meeting for a walk. Join together to pray to the Lord of the harvest.

As a Family



Use dinner time to disciple your kids & impact the nations. Teach them about God's will for every tribe to know him & then pray together for the unreached & our frontline teams.

The Region

This region of central Uganda is home to a Nubian community formed through generations of migration from Sudan and Egypt. Many were given land in exchange for military service and now live closely together, maintaining strong cultural identity. Their history of displacement has made them protective of their land, traditions, and community, creating a tightly knit and often closed environment. **PRAY: Stability and provision for the community; openness within a historically closed culture; continued favor for long-term presence.**

The Unreached Tribe

The Nubian people are considered a frontier unreached group, with nearly all identifying as Muslim. To be Nubian is to be Muslim, and faith is deeply embedded in their identity and culture. As a diasporic people, they have become especially protective of their traditions, making the gospel difficult to receive. Yet there is growing access through Scripture translation and relational ministry. **PRAY: Access to God's Word in their language; openness to Jesus beyond cultural identity; transformation through Scripture.**

The Team

The team has been able to live among the Nubians, a rare opportunity that's opened doors for daily relationship and ministry. They engage the community through small businesses, creating space to pray for and share Jesus—especially among women who are otherwise difficult to reach. Over time, this presence has led to discipleship & new believers, while recent outreach efforts and translation work are expanding gospel access. **PRAY: Continued favor living among the Nubians; fruit through relational ministry; growth of discipleship and new believers.**
