# Engaging in Prayer for Frontline Missions



## ***Saying ‘YES’ to the great commission as you pray***

The great commission is a command given to the church by Jesus; in fact it was his final command to us. When he commissioned us to make disciples in all nations (people groups), he guaranteed we would see this come to fruition through the picture painted in Revelation of every tribe, tongue, people and nation worshipping Jesus around the throne of God.

We can walk in faith-filled obedience to Jesus’ commission by praying according to God’s desire to send laborers and work salvation among those who haven’t heard the gospel preached to them yet.

Engaging in this call to pray doesn’t have to be complicated. Use this guide to know what to pray and then find creative ways to regularly pray that God’s light would pierce the darkest corners of the globe. Here are some ideas to get you started!



## Home Routines



Put the prayer guide on your fridge or mirror & use normal routine times like laundry, cooking, dishes or getting ready to pray for frontline teams.

## Small Groups



Adopt a region as a small group & incorporate a time of prayer to consistently pray for God to work salvation through the teams laboring in that region.

## With a Friend



Set a weekly coffee & prayer date with a friend. It can be as easy as picking up the phone or meeting for a walk. Join together to pray to the Lord of the harvest.

## As a Family



Use dinner time to disciple your kids & impact the nations. Teach them about God's will for every tribe to know him & then pray together for the unreached & our frontline teams.





# Praying for the Kuru Team

## The Region

This region of Northern Uganda, near the South Sudan border, is dry and marked by a single rainy season each year. Life revolves around farming and trade, with many communities also shaped by the presence of large refugee populations. The region carries both hardship and complexity, where social challenges and instability affect daily life. **PRAY: Provision and stability for communities; peace in times of unrest.**

## The Unreached Tribe

The Aringa people have lived in this region for generations, shaped by a long and complicated history. While early Catholic influence was present, a major shift about fifty years ago led many toward Islam through promises of education and opportunity. Today, the majority identify as Muslim, with very few evangelical believers. The Aringa are known for their determination—once they commit to something, they do not waver. While this makes them resistant to the gospel, those who follow Jesus often do so with deep conviction. **PRAY: Open hearts among the Aringa; courage to follow Jesus despite cost; strong and lasting faith among new believers.**

## The Team

The team is made up of families serving together, focused on discipleship and raising up Aringa believers to reach their own people. After recent attacks that damaged homes and the church, they returned to encourage and strengthen local believers. They are also seeing open doors through hospital ministry, praying for the sick and sharing the gospel. Where fear once kept many silent, believers are now stepping forward with courage. **PRAY: Protection and provision; boldness and favor in outreach; courage for believers to remain strong and public in their faith.**





# Praying for the Koboko Team

## The Region

Located in northwest Uganda near the borders of South Sudan and Congo, this region is shaped by trade, migration, and a strong Islamic identity among the Aringa people. Life here is challenging for ministry, with language barriers, high cost of living, and social resistance making it difficult to build trust. Yet through patient, relational presence, doors are opening, and some families are becoming more receptive to conversations about Jesus. **PRAY: Open doors for the gospel; deeper understanding of language & culture; continued favor & trust among local families.**

## The Unreached Tribe

The Aringa people are one of the least reached groups in Uganda, with very few believers. Nearly all identify as Muslim, with faith closely tied to their history, identity, and community life. The Aringa are known for their determination—once they commit, they do not waver. While this creates strong resistance, those who follow Jesus often do so with deep conviction, influencing their families and communities. **PRAY: Spiritual hunger among the Aringa; openness to the gospel despite cultural pressure; multiplying faith within families and communities.**

## The Team

The team is building relationships house to house, returning even after rejection. Over time, hearts have softened—especially as heads of households open doors, allowing families to listen. They gather for prayer and host small evening fellowships where seekers come quietly to learn. Several families now welcome them, and the gospel is spreading through households. **PRAY: Boldness and wisdom in conversations; protection and provision for the team; continued growth of home fellowships and family-centered discipleship.**



# Praying for the Yumbe Team

## The Region

In the northwest corner of Uganda near the South Sudan border, this region is shaped by a long and complex history. The Aringa people were influenced by early Catholic missions and later a shift toward Islam through military recruitment and promises of opportunity. Today, nearly 88% of the region identifies as Muslim, making it one of the least reached areas in Uganda. Recent unrest has brought violence, damaged churches, and an ongoing military presence, leaving both fear and instability. **PRAY: Peace across the region; protection for communities affected by unrest; restoration of damaged homes and churches.**

## The Unreached Tribe

The Aringa people are a Muslim-majority group with very few believers and little gospel access.

Faith is deeply tied to identity and community, and their strong sense of commitment shapes every part of life. While this creates resistance to the gospel, those who follow Jesus often do so with unusual courage and conviction, influencing those around them. **PRAY: Openness to the gospel among the Aringa; bold faith for new believers; influence that spreads through families and communities.**

## The Team

Reaching the Aringa has required patience and deep relationship. Early on, even translators refused to help once they realized the gospel was being shared. So the team slowed down—praying, learning the culture, and going house to house to build trust. Over time, hearts have opened. Even amid recent attacks & displacement, they have returned to strengthen believers, rebuild, & continue discipling the local church. **PRAY: Endurance for the team in long-term ministry; wisdom in building trust; strength to disciple and rebuild in a fragile environment.**
