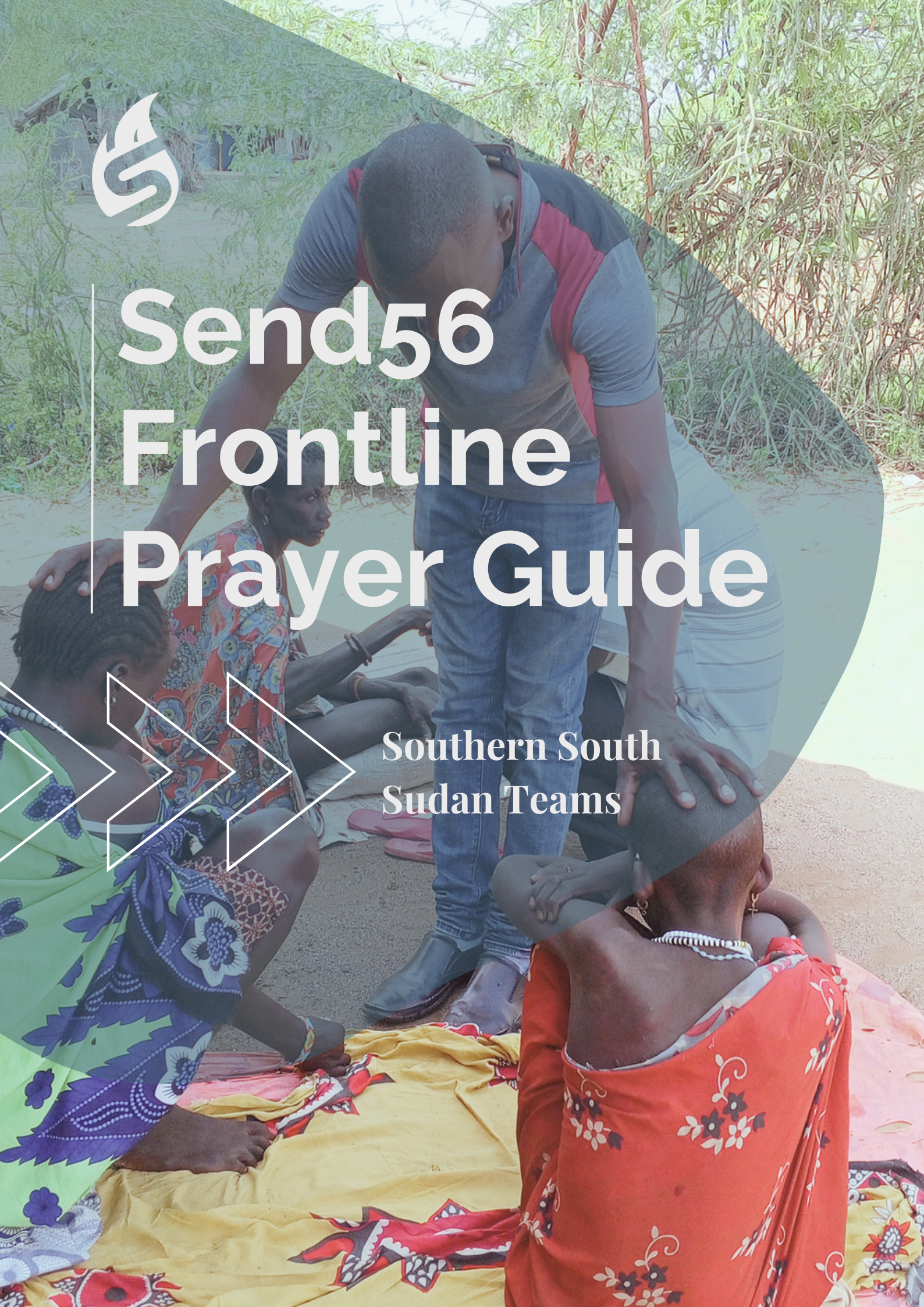

Engaging in Prayer for Frontline Missions



Saying ‘YES’ to the great commission as you pray

The great commission is a command given to the church by Jesus; in fact it was his final command to us. When he commissioned us to make disciples in all nations (people groups), he guaranteed we would see this come to fruition through the picture painted in Revelation of every tribe, tongue, people and nation worshipping Jesus around the throne of God.

We can walk in faith-filled obedience to Jesus’ commission by praying according to God’s desire to send laborers and work salvation among those who haven’t heard the gospel preached to them yet.

Engaging in this call to pray doesn’t have to be complicated. Use this guide to know what to pray and then find creative ways to regularly pray that God’s light would pierce the darkest corners of the globe. Here are some ideas to get you started!



Home Routines



Put the prayer guide on your fridge or mirror & use normal routine times like laundry, cooking, dishes or getting ready to pray for frontline teams.

Small Groups



Adopt a region as a small group & incorporate a time of prayer to consistently pray for God to work salvation through the teams laboring in that region.

With a Friend



Set a weekly coffee & prayer date with a friend. It can be as easy as picking up the phone or meeting for a walk. Join together to pray to the Lord of the harvest.

As a Family



Use dinner time to disciple your kids & impact the nations. Teach them about God's will for every tribe to know him & then pray together for the unreached & our frontline teams.



Praying for the Narus Team

The Region

Narus is a remote area in South Sudan marked by conflict and severe underdevelopment. Access to clean water, healthcare, and education is extremely limited, and many surrounding villages are even more isolated. The Toposa people rely on livestock and small-scale farming, often moving in search of water and pasture. Despite these challenges, the region serves as a hub for surrounding communities, creating opportunities for connection and ministry.

PRAY: Provision for basic needs like water and healthcare; stability in an underdeveloped region; open doors for ministry among remote communities.

The Unreached Tribe

The Toposa people are pastoralists whose lives are closely tied to their livestock and the land. Many practice traditional beliefs and rely on spiritual powers, witch doctors, and rituals for protection and healing. Literacy is low, making oral communication essential, and many are eager to hear God's Word in their own language. Though gospel access has been limited, there is growing openness as people encounter the power of Christ. **PRAY: Freedom from reliance on witchcraft and spiritual fear; understanding of the gospel through oral and audio Scripture; lasting faith among new believers.**

The Team

The team is serving both physical and spiritual needs, using medical care and outreach to open doors for the gospel. They have established fellowships in remote villages where people gather to hear God's Word. One woman, after seeking healing from a witch doctor, heard the gospel on the road, threw away what she had been given, and surrendered her life to Christ.

PRAY: Continued fruit through medical and outreach ministry; boldness in sharing the gospel; protection and strength in difficult conditions.
