Engaging in Prayer for Frontline Missions



Saying ‘YES’ to the great commission as you pray

The great commission is a command given to the church by Jesus; in fact it was his final command to us. When he commissioned us to make disciples in all nations (people groups), he guaranteed we would see this come to fruition through the picture painted in Revelation of every tribe, tongue, people and nation worshipping Jesus around the throne of God.

We can walk in faith-filled obedience to Jesus’ commission by praying according to God’s desire to send laborers and work salvation among those who haven’t heard the gospel preached to them yet.

Engaging in this call to pray doesn’t have to be complicated. Use this guide to know what to pray and then find creative ways to regularly pray that God’s light would pierce the darkest corners of the globe. Here are some ideas to get you started!



Home Routines



Put the prayer guide on your fridge or mirror & use normal routine times like laundry, cooking, dishes or getting ready to pray for frontline teams.

Small Groups



Adopt a region as a small group & incorporate a time of prayer to consistently pray for God to work salvation through the teams laboring in that region.

With a Friend



Set a weekly coffee & prayer date with a friend. It can be as easy as picking up the phone or meeting for a walk. Join together to pray to the Lord of the harvest.

As a Family



Use dinner time to disciple your kids & impact the nations. Teach them about God's will for every tribe to know him & then pray together for the unreached & our frontline teams.



Praying for the Jos Team

The Region

This region of north-central Nigeria sits along a fragile divide marked by years of religious conflict and violence. Entire communities have been displaced, and recent attacks have left deep wounds across the region. In the midst of fear and instability, there is both great need and a growing openness as people search for hope. **PRAY: *Peace in the midst of ongoing conflict; protection for vulnerable communities; hope to take root where fear has dominated.***

The Unreached Tribe

The Fulani people are a Muslim-majority group shaped by strong cultural values of honor, identity, and tradition. Faith is deeply tied to community life, and following Jesus often comes with rejection and loss. Yet even in this resistance, the gospel is beginning to take root, and when individuals respond, their faith can impact entire families. **PRAY: *Openness among the Fulani; courage to follow Christ despite cost; the gospel to spread through families and communities.***

The Team

This team is stepping into a region where the need is urgent and the harvest is already evident. Some on the team come from Muslim backgrounds, giving them unique understanding and connection as they share the gospel. In a place where open gatherings are difficult, small groups of believers are beginning to meet in quiet and creative ways. Many are newly following Christ, and local believers are asking for workers who will stay and walk with them in discipleship even in the midst of risk and instability. **PRAY: *Boldness to step into the harvest; wisdom to disciple new believers well; protection as they serve in a high-risk environment.***



Praying for the Lima Katumgo Team

The Region

This area of north central Nigeria is shaped by dry savannah landscapes, farming communities, and tightly connected village life. For generations, trade, migration, and strong Islamic influence from Hausa and Fulani culture have shaped the identity of the region. Daily life is deeply communal, with traditions tied closely to faith, family, and local leadership. **PRAY:** *Continued openness in resistant communities; favor with local leaders; wisdom to walk faithfully through new opportunities.*

The Unreached Tribe

The Bankalawa people are primarily Muslim and live in close knit village communities centered around farming and trade. Many live with a strong awareness of spiritual powers and a deep respect for traditional authority structures. While there has been limited gospel witness among them, interest is growing as people encounter Scripture, ask questions about faith, and seek understanding in their own language. **PRAY:** *Spiritual freedom from fear and bondage; hunger for God's Word in the Bankal language; disciples raised up to reach neighboring villages.*

The Team

The team has experienced unusual favor among the Bankalawa, with local leaders welcoming their presence and opening doors for ministry and long term relationships. Through teaching in small bible studies, daily interactions, and shared work alongside villagers, trust is growing and people are beginning to ask honest questions about Christianity and Islam. The team's vision is to disciple local believers and see the gospel spread into surrounding villages. **PRAY:** *Protection and discernment for the team; continued openness and trust in the community; local believers equipped to carry the gospel to other villages.*
