

How to Start and Run Just Show Up (JSU) Book Club

I. General Guidelines

1. Do in-person, Zoom, or hybrid. 1-3 times a week or bi-weekly.
2. Meet for 30-90 minutes in general. If possible, serve food.
3. Everyone should have a book (print or digital). Play audiobook or read live. Books can be read partially.
4. Read/listen together for 15-60 minutes.
5. Discuss/share for 15-60 minutes.
6. Have minimum of 2 people. Encourage people to join with a friend or two.
7. When possible, everyone should have an opportunity to speak/share same amount of time (1-3 mins per person; use timer alarm).
8. Do not use phone or multitask to focus on learning and respect one another.

II. Sharing Guidelines (Go over in Every Meeting)

1. Mention your name and where you are from.
2. Everyone speaks same amount of time (1-3 mins per person; use timer alarm) or you can skip.
3. Reference specific page numbers when appropriate.
4. Focus on sharing what you learned or disagreed with.
5. When sharing, use "I" not "we" or "you." This helps each person learn and share independently. Facilitator will correct you when mistakes are made.
6. If you have a question, mention it and discuss privately afterwards.

III. Benefits of Just Show Up Book Club

- Finishing books by just showing up.
- No homework! Pre-reading is totally optional.
- Learning from authors & participants.
- Can read books of all subjects: Theology, History, Investing, Management, Hobbies, Science, etc.
- Doable in many settings such as family, office, church, schools, etc.
- Reading together increases private reading.
- Reading & listening simultaneously helps focus on the content.
- Enhances understanding & knowledge.
