# Cultivating Connections: Building Partnerships to Address Hunger, Nutrition & Health Webinars

We have hosted three previous webinars addressing partnerships to promote hunger, nutrition and health. Please see the high-level overview and key takeaways from each:

**January:** During this webinar, we heard from the Dr. Judy Monroe, President and CEO of CDC Foundation as we discussed the importance of the commitments to the National Strategy on Hunger, Nutrition and Health as well as the importance of collaboration and public-private partnerships. We also shared highlights from the third survey of the Commitments to the National Strategy.

**February:** In this month's partner call, our panelists discussed how mayors are driving local solutions to fight hunger and improve health & wellbeing in communities across the US. #### **Partner Spotlight: Dreaming Out Loud**

This month we would like to highlight one of the ten Community-Based Organizations that are part of our CBO Innovation Lab. Based in Washington DC, Dreaming Out Loud has been rebuilding urban, community-based food systems, helping to increase access to healthy food and improve community health, developing low-income entrepreneurs and cooperatives, and training at-risk adult residents for sustainable, family-supporting wages since 2008.

With two urban farms, a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program, and farmers markets, Dreaming Out Loud grows and provides

food for their community. They are also working to expand and build the Marion Barry Avenue Market, that will provide a place to buy locally sourced food East of the River as well as a hub for community engagement and building connections. It will include a demo kitchen to support nutrition education and cooking classes, a cafe that allows you to sit down with friends and community members, and events with leaders in the community.
