## Looking back, believing forward: Rev. Tom Phillips

Recently, while studying for our December preaching series on Isaiah, I read an interesting comment in John Oswalt's New International Commentary (my favorite commentary series). He mentioned that the Israelites walked into the future backwards, while facing their past. For them, the past was their best guide forward, as they learned to trust God's faithfulness in the future through seeing it amidst their past wanderings; even the wayward ones. I love that.

With this in mind, it's a joy to think back over all that has transpired at Holy Trinity in the past 5+ years, post COVID, and consider the ways the Lord has been faithful to the parish. In an era where the median Episcopal Church attendance is now just 38 parishioners (not a typo), Holy Trinity is an obvious stand-out. The Lord has chosen to preserve and to flourish the hard work and faithfulness of so many members across the decades. Praise God.

Holy Trinity has grown consecutively all 5 years post COVID. In 2024, the parish grew from an average Sunday attendance of 225 to 276. Our growth continued in 2025, with our Sunday attendance averaging above 330 for the year.

There are so many bright spots to point towards. We baptized 22 members in 2025, nearly tripling from the previous year. We've seen our children's ministry grow tremendously, with 40 regular attenders (ages 11 and under). We've started a missions partnership with Honduras, made significant facilities improvements like the parking lot and patio space, and grown our small group ministries, with over 150 members participating. Lastly, many of our ministry teams grew, and processes for our ministries continue to strengthen and improve. The parish is flourishing, thank you Lord, and thank you!

Interestingly, there are just over 6700 Episcopal congregations across the nation, and yet 29% of the weekly attendance takes place in just 181 of the largest congregations. Holy Trinity is in this group, which means that the Lord has gifted us with an unusual measure of influence, leadership and "talent." Let's not bury it (referring to the parable of the talents, Mt 25:14-30). We have a leadership role to play in our diocese, and we've taken that place through hosting events like the Daughters of the King fall assembly, 2025 Diocesan Altar Guild assembly, diocesan youth beach day, the upcoming diocesan mens' retreat, and the 2026 Grounded youth event. This is all happening through the leadership, support and participation of our staff and members. Thank you!

It is my prayer that the Lord will continue to help us take our place as a resourcing parish that would effectively reach people in Melbourne and the world with the life changing good news of Christ's love. In 2026 we will work to continue to create opportunities for young and old to take their next steps towards knowing Christ and making Him known. Let's expect the faithfulness of the Lord to continue in the year ahead. We clearly see it in our past, let's believe it for our future, and walk towards it together in faith, hope and the joyful expectation that God has more planned, for His glory and our lasting good.

## A New Mission Partnership Begins



In November, Rev. Tom, Rev. Daniel and Dave Lacy visited St John the Apostle Church in Siguatepeque, Honduras to establish a missions partnership at the invitation of Bishop Lloyd Allen, the Bishop of Honduras.

Honduras is one of 7 nations that comprise of our province of the Anglican Communion. For decades, Honduras has been our companion diocese within our province. The nation itself is developing. The median age is 24. At age 45, I (Tom) am older than 91% of the population. I felt like an old man when I was there; a feeling I very much hope to know more about one day!

Currently, a handful of parishes across our diocese maintain mission partnerships in Honduras. St. Peter's in Lake Mary built a medical facility that has been in operation for over a decade. The Cathedral Church of St Luke is in a partnership with the Honduran Cathedral Church and School. Incarnation Oviedo partners with a parish in San Pedro Sula. This year, we are joining St. Barnabas Deland in their partnership with St John the Apostle Church and School.



## About St. John the Apostle, Siguatepeque

St John's is a flagship parish in Honduras with a long history of ministry and a lot of potential. It's located in the central highlands of the country, along C5, the major road from Panama to Mexico. The town's population is about 75,000 and it is considered one of the most desirable places to live in the nation. It's safer and quieter than the large coastal cities, and it contains a large working middle class population.

A major focus of our partnership with St John's will be helping to strengthen their bilingual school. English fluency is a major skillset, and students who learn English in school have 30-50% greater income potential than those who are not bilingual. The public schools in Honduras are Spanish speaking only, and the education ends in 7<sup>th</sup> grade. St John's is meeting this need for bilingual education, and they are also meeting the spiritual needs of the students through robust daily chapel and a Christ centered learning environment. Strengthening the school is the best way to increase St John's impact for Christ in their community.



## How We Hope to Engage

In speaking with Bishop Allen and Father Francisco Lone, the Rector of St John's, several opportunities to engage are developing. We are working to arrange a summer trip (June 29-July 4) to continue to get to know the congregation and school. We are talking about whether it's possible to do conversational English with students via zoom year-round. We are also exploring what it would cost to help fund several much-needed facilities improvements (a soccer field and roof for the basketball court). There would also be opportunity to scholarship students to the school, or even help underwrite teacher salaries. The US dollar has a big impact in Honduras. Tuition for one student for an entire year is \$1100 US. A teacher's annual salary is under \$8,000.




## Ryan Malchow Ordination




## Thursday morning 10:30am Bible Study Deep Dive


## WALK IN THE SPIRIT


