



# Garden stake

2 × 2 nominal · 4" and 8" lengths · Robinia pseudoacacia

One species, milled four-square and ready to drive. Black locust outlasts pressure-treated stakes without a drop of chemistry — no copper, no creosote, no compromise on what your tomatoes touch.

*A garden built on locust is a garden that outlasts the gardener.*



Both lengths in the bed — 8' trellis uprights behind 4' stakes. Honey-amber settling toward silver-gray.
