PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

ENTRY DEADLINE:

DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING ENTRY FORMS IN PERSON AT THE DAS OFFICE IS MONDAY JULY 6TH @ 5PM

ONLINE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UNTIL 10PM ON MONDAY.

LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS.

There will be an Awards Ceremony on Saturday, July 11th to recognize the exhibitors with the most points per section.

ENTRIES:

- **Online entries begin APRIL 1, 2026**
- **Entries in all classes are preferred to be entered online: <https://www.assistexpo.ca/dufferin-ag-society>**
- **OR brought in-person to the DAS Office using the completed [entry form](#) attached, or found on our website.**
- **Once your registration has been processed, entry tags will be automatically emailed to you to print at home.**

Specific times and dates mentioned in this booklet are subject to change, in which case we will notify all exhibitors via email. Please make sure that you include an active email address when making your entries.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and completed within the past two years.
2. Exhibits must not have previously taken a prize at any Dufferin Agricultural Society Exhibition.
3. Only 1 entry will be allowed per exhibitor in each class.
4. **New Rule:** Adults with cognitive or developmental differences that may affect their participation in the adult section are encouraged to contact the Exhibit Hall committee, as they may be eligible to enter the junior section (*18 years and under*) based on individual circumstances.
5. **Exhibits must be brought to the Exhibit Hall with entry tags attached.** Tags must be taped or pinned securely to the item, with the bottom of the tag folded up to the front, covering the name. (Do not leave the name visible from behind.) **Please horizontally tape, or paper clip the tag. Do not staple.**
6. Exhibitors are encouraged to pre-sort entries by section and class number.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for entering their exhibit in the proper class. **Please note the separate Adult, Junior, and School sections, and choose accordingly.**
8. **Entry Drop off times are Tuesday, July 7, between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. or Wednesday, July 8 between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. Articles not received by 10 a.m. Wednesday, July 8 will not be entered for judging.**
9. The directors will take every precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of exhibits sent to the exhibition, and should property be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, they will give all the assistance in their power toward recovery of same, but will not accept financial responsibility.
10. A meeting of the directors will be held, notices of which will be given, to hear and decide any complaint or grievances that may have arisen in the awarding of prizes. Protests must be made in writing to the Secretary within 7 days after the close of the exhibition
11. The society will not be responsible for articles left after the last day of the fair.
12. Any infringement of the rules and regulations will result in withholding the prizes.

JUDGING & PRIZES:

1. Scoring of points in all classes are as follows:
 - 1st place - 3 points
 - 2nd place -2 point
 - 3rd place - 1 point

3. **All exhibits will be closed off at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, July 11**
4. **Articles may be removed from the Exhibit Building on Saturday July 11, between 8:00 pm & 9:30 pm, Monday July 13 at 1-4 pm. Times are subject to change – in which case we will contact you personally.**
5. Any articles not picked up at the fair will be discarded or donated.
6. All entry tags will be opened after judging

QUICK BREADS:

8. Bran muffins – 4 muffins

- *All entries must be made in proper preserving jars, sealed. Canned items must have screw-on ring top. No paraffin wax.*
- *All canned goods entered must be prepared using proper canning practices. Water bath canning is required for high-acid foods, and pressure canning is required for low-acid foods. Oven-canned items will not be accepted.*
- *Jars will be opened for judging.*
- *Exhibits will be scored by: Appearance, Container, Quart, Pint, or Half Pint, Flavour, Texture, Seal.*

8. Any 2 Heritage vegetables- include horticultural name and seed package, if available
