Cadet Awards Committee responsibilities

Annual awards are administered by RSL WA and open to Australian Navy, Army and Air Force Cadets and Cadets WA (Police Rangers and Surf Life Savers) in Western Australia. The committee is responsible for determining the successful award recipients of the following awards:

- **The Bill Collidge Spirit of ANZAC Cadet of the Year. Awarded to the cadet who** demonstrates overall excellence (Uniform, Dress and Bearing, First Aid Theory, General Knowledge, and delivery of a three-minute presentation of 'What the Spirit of Anzac Means to me' within each Stream (Navy, Army, Air Force and Cadets WA).
- **RSL WA Trustees' Community Spirit Award: awarded to the cadet who demonstrates significant** involvement in volunteer community service beyond mandatory community activities within their Cadet Stream
- **RSL WA Cadet Unit Efficiency Shield Award:** awarded to the most efficient individual Unit within each Stream (Navy, Army, Air Force and Cadets WA).

Schedule of committee requirements and actions

November – February: entry applications are received by cadets.

January/February: Cadet Awards Committee holds an Assessment Day at 509 ACU Cannington (full day commitment).

March: Award winners are announced at the RSL WA Annual Cadet Award evening and selection of representatives to escort the cadet award winners to Canberra.

It is a requirement for all members of the Cadet Awards Committee to hold a valid and current Working with Children Check (WWCC) for the duration of their time on the committee.

Applications should include a cover letter of no more than 400 words and a CV outlining the skills and experience that the candidate brings to the Cadet Awards Committee.

Successful applicants will form a talent pool who will be appointed to the Cadet Awards Committee as vacancies arise. Roles are voluntary and non-remunerated. Applicants' details will be held by RSL WA for a period of three years.
