

Endor Patches

Fix the vulnerability without upgrading the dependency

Open source vulnerabilities are easy to find and hard to fix — the security fix usually lives in a much newer version, bundled with changes that could break the application. Endor Patches backport the vetted upstream security fix to the version you are already running — minimal, reproducible, and auditable — so teams close critical CVEs without an upgrade.

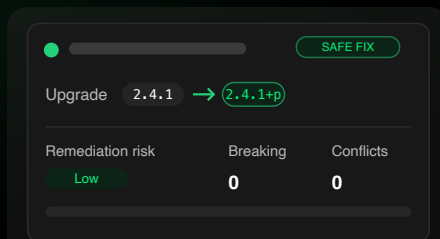

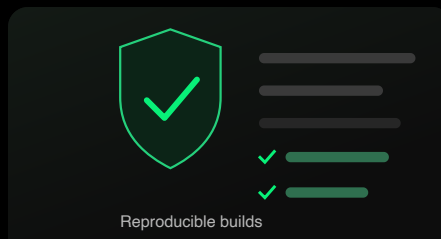
How it works



PATCH

Close CVEs where you are

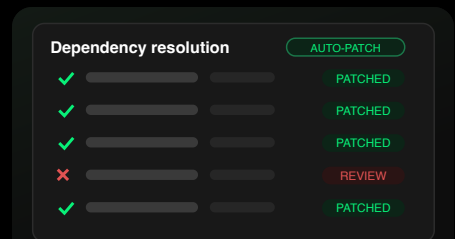
- Backport the upstream security fix to the version you already run — no upgrade required
- Resolve transitive dependency vulnerabilities that aren't in your direct control
- Apply patches across hundreds or thousands of repositories without per-repo pull requests



VERIFY

Minimal and reproducible by design

- Scope every patch to the security fix only — no extra changes, no new conflicts
- Build hermetic, reproducible artifacts that auditors, 3PAOs, and QSAs can verify
- Provide the provenance evidence compliance teams need for SLSA Level 3 attestations



AUTOMATE

Fixed on the next build

- Auto-patching prioritizes patched artifacts during dependency resolution — no code change
- Drop into JFrog, Nexus, GitHub, and GitLab without rip-and-replace
- Take the handoff from Upgrade Impact Analysis when an upgrade is too disruptive

WHY NOW

Remediation is the bottleneck in every AppSec program

Asking developers to upgrade their way out of every CVE taxes the business without making it measurably more secure — and for vulnerabilities buried deep in the dependency tree, there is no clean upgrade path at all. Meanwhile auditors and 3PAOs need proof that each vulnerability is actually fixed, with a clear record of what changed and why. Backported patches close both gaps: the CVE resolves on the next build, and the fix comes with evidence you can hand to an auditor.
