Corona Police Department patrol unit #79350 - This vehicle was possessed and operated by Officer Evans during the incident. The vehicle sustained damage to the rear passenger side window. Based on the direction of the officer's involved in the officer involved shooting, it is believed this damage was caused by an expended round. The bullet caused damage to the window but did not penetrate all the way through into the vehicle as it struck an interior pillar. At my direction, Forensic Technician Walker captured overall photographs of the exterior and interior of this vehicle for documentation purposes.

██████████ - This vehicle was occupied by the registered owner, ██████████ during the time that Kiavik Miranda intentionally drove his vehicle into the driver's door of the Chevrolet Silverado. At my direction, Forensic Technician De La Hoya captured overall photographs of the exterior and interior of the vehicle.

The truck sustained severe damage to the front driver's door and damaged the metal running board on the driver's side of the vehicle. The front windshield was smashed/damaged by Kiavik Miranda using a tire iron to damage the window. The passenger side mirror sustained moderate damage and the front passenger side tire was deflated and pushed off of the rim due to being pushed into the east side wall of Applebee's following the collision.

On 11/18/2025 at approximately 1530 hours, the registered owner, ██████████ was notified that his vehicle had been processed and was ready to be picked up. ██████████ stated he would respond to the Corona Police Department to obtain his vehicle on a later date.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE (Applebee' s):

On 11/18/2025, I authored a search warrant requesting the original surveillance footage from Applebee's located at 521 N. McKinley Ave in the City of Corona, County of Riverside. The search warrant was reviewed and approved by Riverside County Honorable Judge Hester at 1629 hours. On 11/19/2025, the search warrant was provided to the Flynn Group, the parent company to Applebee's, via email at their request. On 11/19/2025 at approximately 1147 hours, I received an email from ██████████ stating the Flynn Group was in receipt of the search warrant. I provided ██████████ an Axon community request link via email ██████████ to upload the video for evidentiary purposes.

On 11/25/2025, ██████████ provided and uploaded 8 video's from Applebee's to evidence.com via the Axon community request. The videos provided include the interior and exterior of the building.

DETAILS CONTINUED:

On 11/19/2025, I provided Detective Arens copies of the signed search warrants in reference to the Honda Civic and the surveillance video request. At the direction of Detective Arens, I was advised not to process the Honda Civic for evidentiary purposes and to only document the collection of the surveillance footage from Applebee's.

This concludes my involvement in the listed case.

DETAILS:

On 11-18-2025, I responded to assist on an officer involved shooting which occurred near N. McKinley St. and Promenade Ave, Corona (County of Riverside). When I arrived, other members of the detective bureau and I were briefed on the incident. I was then assigned to survey the area with Detective Mason and Detective Jolin to determine what, if any, items needed to be collected as potential evidence in the investigation. Please see Detective Mason's report for further.

I then contacted [REDACTED] of Applebee's to locate surveillance footage of this incident. When I contacted [REDACTED] she stated she had observed the male prior to the incident. The following is a summary of our conversation. On 11-17-2025 at approximately 2200 hours, [REDACTED] was working at the location and observed a male near a gray Honda sedan in the south parking lot of the location. The male is believed to be SU01, and the Honda is believed to be SU01's vehicle (CA-9VOE098). [REDACTED] described the male as a white male adult, 5'8", stocky build, wearing jeans and a reflective yellow vest. The male was "dancing" in the parking lot for approximately two hours. [REDACTED] also stated he was on the ground and appeared to be breakdancing. [REDACTED] stated she never observed anyone with the male and never heard any music that the male could have been dancing to. Due to [REDACTED] working inside the location, she could not get a good view of the male but didn't recognize him. [REDACTED] stated she believed the male was having a "psychotic break" or "drugged out." On 11-18-2025 at approximately 0025 hours, [REDACTED] walked out to her parked vehicle via the north exit of Applebee's. A couple minutes later she drove away via the north driveway onto Promenade Ave. Prior to leaving, she did not see if the male or his vehicle were still in the parking lot.

[REDACTED] then showed me surveillance footage from the east side surveillance camera. It should be noted that [REDACTED] allowed me to record footage using my department issued cell phone, but a formal request was required by the Flynn Group to obtain a hard copy. The footage I collected was later uploaded to Evidence.com. Please see Detective Walker's report for his authoring of a search warrant and formal request for the footage.

I then contacted [REDACTED] of Hikari Sushi & Ramen to locate surveillance footage of this incident. [REDACTED] had already downloaded the footage to his phone and provided it to me (later uploaded to Evidence.com). The footage shows SU01 attempting to break the driver's side window of a vehicle with a tire iron. The vehicle (yet to be identified) was parked on the north side of the business and

appeared unoccupied at the time of the incident. [REDACTED] was hesitant in providing me with any information about the vehicle's owner but stated it was his employees, with the last name [REDACTED] agreed to take my phone number and give it to [REDACTED] to contact me. At the time of this report, [REDACTED] is yet to contact me.

SCENE:

Applebee's parking lot, located at 521 North McKinley St. in the City of Corona, County of Riverside.

DETAILS:

On 11/18/2025 at approximately 0035 hours, I responded to the area of McKinley St. and Promenade Ave. in reference to a man with a possible crowbar in his hand, running up to vehicles that were driving in the street. While in route to the location, Officer Evans stated over the radio that he was involved in an Officer involved shooting.

Upon arrival to the location, I took a perimeter position at the intersection of Promenade Ave and Shopping Center. While I was setting up my traffic cones and putting up caution tape to stop vehicle and pedestrian traffic from entering the scene, a male Hispanic, later identified as [REDACTED] approached me. [REDACTED] is primarily Spanish speaking but was able to talk a little bit in English to me. [REDACTED] stated there was a guy that was chasing him. I could see [REDACTED] had blood dripping down the left side of his head behind his ear.

I had [REDACTED] take a seat on the curb and requested the Corona City Fire Department take a look at him. As the Fire personnel was looking over [REDACTED] for his injuries, I could see [REDACTED] had a laceration to the back of his left ear and his left cheek/ jaw area appeared to be swollen.

Sgt. Jurado came to my location and assisted in translation for me. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement translated to me by Sgt. Jurado. [REDACTED] stated he got off of work at Applebee's and saw a male walking around outside Applebee's Restaurant without a shirt. The male then put a reflective style jacket on. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] then got into his vehicle and began to drive away. The male that just put the reflective jacket on then drove his car into [REDACTED] vehicle.

[REDACTED] then got out of his vehicle to see what was going on. The male then started cursing at [REDACTED]. After cursing at [REDACTED] the male then walked to his trunk to retrieve something. [REDACTED] stated he then took off running from the location, jumping over the hood of his car. As [REDACTED] was running, the male began chasing him. [REDACTED] stated he believed that the male had a gun in his hand as he was chasing [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he ran into the apartment complex to the north of Applebee's and as he was running he heard what he believed to be shots.

During this part of the interview, [REDACTED] complained of pain to the left side of his face and was transported by AMR to Corona Regional Medical Center. I followed AMR to the hospital and stood by with [REDACTED] until Officer Alvarez relieved me from the Hospital.

DETAILS:

On 11/18/2025, I was working patrol as a Field Training Officer and was riding with trainee, Officer Johnson. At approximately 0034 hours, I heard Officer Evans state over the radio, "One at gun point". Officer Johnson and I responded "Code Three" (meaning lights and sirens activated) to his location. When we arrived on scene, I located Officer Escoto and Officer Evans on the east side of Applebee's (521 North McKinley). Officer Johnson parked our patrol car on the street and I approached the scene on foot.

Once I entered the scene, I saw a male, who was later identified as suspect Kiavik Miranda. Kiavik was laying on the ground bleeding from wounds to his torso. Officer Gardner was providing medical aid to Kiavik. I located Officer Evans and Officer Escoto standing together approximately 15 yards east of where Kiavik was laying. I asked them who shot their weapon and they told me they both did. I instructed them to ensure their body worn cameras were off.

Sgt Jurado walked up to us and asked us if we were okay. Once we assured him we were, he asked if our body worn cameras (BWCs) were turned off which we told them they were. After Sgt Jurado obtained a public safety statement from both Officer Evans and Officer Escoto, Sgt Jurado ordered me not to speak to Officer Escoto about the incident, asked me to drive Officer Escoto to the station, keep him separate from Officer Evans, and remain with him until I was relieved. I told him I understood and I drove Officer Escoto back to the Corona Police station where I sat with him until we were both relieved to go home.

PURPOSE:

Interviewed two witnesses, [REDACTED] at their residence.

DETAILS:

On 11/18/2025 at 0029 hours, an officer-involved shooting occurred in the parking lot of 521 N McKinley Street in the city of Corona, county of Riverside.

At approximately 0140 hours, I arrived at the command post in response to the listed incident. I was directed to locate and interview a witness, [REDACTED]

I contacted [REDACTED] and responded to his residence at 1300 hours. Upon my arrival, he confirmed he was the passenger and his [REDACTED] was the driver of their vehicle, a [REDACTED]. Detective Goudy and I interviewed [REDACTED] first in an upstairs bedroom away from [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of his statement.

At approximately 0030 hours, he and his [REDACTED] were driving home from work, carpooling southbound on Hidden Valley Road. As they approached the intersection near Applebee's, they observed a man standing in the middle of the street waving his hands, seemingly attempting to flag them down. Due to the darkness and uncertainty of the man's intentions, they did not stop and continued driving. As they neared the intersection, they noticed another individual on the opposite corner near Applebee's. This individual (later identified as Kiavik Miranda) was described as a bald Hispanic male wearing a construction vest and lighter-colored pants. He was holding a crowbar and appeared to be approaching a truck that was stopped at the light, preparing to make a left turn heading northeast. The driver of the truck appeared frightened, drove off quickly, and went through the red light.

[REDACTED] stated that as they waited at the red light, the man with the crowbar walked to the sidewalk in front of Applebee's and began hitting himself in the head with the crowbar. He appeared to be in distress or experiencing some sort of episode. The man then walked around the other side of Applebee's, and [REDACTED] temporarily lost sight of him. When their light turned green, they made a left turn slowly, remaining cautious due to the suspicious behavior they had observed. As they turned, they noticed a truck and a car that had collided in the parking lot near Applebee's. The man with the crowbar was near the vehicles, and [REDACTED] believed he might have been involved in the collision.

[REDACTED] then saw the man begin hitting the vehicles with the crowbar and then move to another car, described as a possible blue Mitsubishi Lancer, where he smashed the windows. At this point, the man noticed [REDACTED] and his brother had stopped and were watching him. The man made a motion as if he were going to throw the crowbar at their vehicle, which made them feel threatened. [REDACTED] described the motion as similar to a bowling gesture. Concerned for their safety, they decided

to leave before he could get to their vehicle.

As they drove away, [REDACTED] observed the man turning his attention toward other vehicles in the parking lot. Security personnel arrived on scene shortly after, and [REDACTED] believed the situation was being handled. He and his [REDACTED] continued to their apartment, located nearby. As [REDACTED] exited the vehicle, he heard approximately four to five gunshots, followed by a brief pause, and then another four shots. He immediately got back into the car, and they drove toward the scene to see what had occurred. Upon arrival, they observed officers on scene and decided to provide information about the man they had seen earlier.

[REDACTED] described the man (Miranda) with the crowbar as a bald Hispanic male of average to slightly above-average height with a beard. He was wearing a construction vest and lighter-colored pants. [REDACTED] did not observe any tattoos or other distinguishing features as the man was wearing long sleeves. He did not see Miranda with any weapons other than the crowbar.

[REDACTED] also mentioned seeing another individual earlier in the incident. This person had been waving his hands in the street, attempting to flag them down. Due to the darkness, [REDACTED] was unable to provide a detailed description but stated the individual appeared to be wearing long sleeves and lighter-colored pants. He believed the person might have been white or Hispanic with facial hair. [REDACTED] did not observe any visible injuries on this individual but, upon reflection, believed the man was running away from Miranda and attempting to get help.

[REDACTED] stated he works in mental health and drug addiction treatment as a behavioral health technician. Based on his experience, he believed the man with the crowbar was not in a stable mental state and might have been under the influence of substances or experiencing a psychotic episode. When asked if he believed the man would have attacked police officers, [REDACTED] stated, "Yeah. I mean, I know that he busted in the windows on that security car too, so I don't think it mattered who it would've been."

This concluded the interview with [REDACTED]. For further details, please refer to the Axon video recording.

I then proceeded to interview [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of his statement.

[REDACTED] stated that as they approached the intersection near Applebee's, they saw a man waving his hands in the street but did not stop. Shortly after, they observed the man with the crowbar crossing the street toward a truck stopped at the light. The truck ran the red light to avoid the man, who then returned to the sidewalk near Applebee's. [REDACTED] described the man hitting himself in the head with the crowbar in what appeared to be an act of frustration rather than an attempt to cause serious harm.

[REDACTED] stated that as they made their left turn, they saw the man smashing windows of a car in the parking lot. He stopped his vehicle in the driveway of the parking lot to observe the man's actions, which he described as being "nosey." As soon as the man noticed their car, he began walking toward them, dragging the crowbar. [REDACTED] felt threatened and decided to drive away slowly. As they left the area, the man redirected his aggression toward other vehicles in the parking lot. [REDACTED] stated that he then drove his [REDACTED] home, directly [REDACTED] from where the incident occurred. After arriving, he heard gunshots. They both immediately returned to provide information to officers.

██████ described the man with the crowbar as a bald Latino male wearing a construction vest and lighter-colored pants. He did not observe any other weapons on the man. ██████ also mentioned seeing the individual waving his hands in the street earlier but was unable to provide a detailed description due to the darkness.

I asked ██████ "Based on what you saw and the way he was acting, do you think he would be a threat to law enforcement officers if they came in contact with him?" ██████ responded, "Absolutely," and described the man as "very aggressive" and not appearing to be in the right state of mind.

PURPOSE:

The following supplemental is to detail the search of Kiavik Miranda's former residence and to document a statement from his former [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

DETAILS:

On 11/18/2025 at 0029 hours, an officer-involved shooting occurred in the parking lot of 521 N McKinley Street in the city of Corona, county of Riverside.

I responded to the scene and was assigned to visit the location listed on the suspect, Kiavik Miranda's, driver's license. The address listed was 2117 Alpinemist in the city of Corona. I went to the location along with Detective R. Eddy and Sergeant D. Matson at approximately 0340 hours.

I knocked on the front door and made contact with an individual who identified himself as [REDACTED]. He stated that he was the [REDACTED] (this home is used as a halfway home and generally houses individuals on parole or probation). I asked him if Miranda still had a room at the location, and he said no, that Miranda had been removed from the residence for a prior incident in which he got a weapon and was a danger to the house. I asked him if he had any property in the home, and he stated he believed he might have. He gave us permission to go to Miranda's room to check.

We proceeded to the top of the stairs and entered a room located near the southeast corner of the home. When [REDACTED] opened the door, we saw that there were four twin-sized beds on the four corners of the room. None of the beds appeared to have been used, and there did not seem to be any personal property inside the room.

After confirming that there was no property in the room that belonged to Miranda, we asked [REDACTED] about Miranda's behavior while living in the home.

The following is a summary of the statements received from [REDACTED]. For a detailed account of his statements, refer to the audio/video captured on my BWC:

[REDACTED] said Miranda had been staying in the home since about March or April. He stated that he believed he was motivated to move forward in life and that he would smile when you talked to him. However, within the last couple of months, his behavior started to change. He said about five weeks ago, there was a different look in his eyes. He began acting weird. He said he used to stay in a different room, but that he blocked the door to the room by flipping his roommate's bed around and barricading the door. He told everyone that they could not get in. CPD was called and responded to the scene, but decided to leave him in the room (CPD CR #25-070698).

He reported that when Miranda did exit the room, he was sweating heavily as if he had just ran a 10k marathon.

Approximately two weeks prior, [REDACTED] said he called CPD again because he grabbed a weapon from the toolbox. He described the weapon as a saw. He said he also saw him grab a knife from the

kitchen and was sharpening the knife, so he called CPD because it was a safety concern. (CPD CR #25-081071).

Later that day, Officer Pablo located Miranda and arrested him for a parole violation (CPD CR #25-081109).

This concluded the statements received and our visit to the residence.

DETAILS:

On 11/18/25 at approximately 0200 hours, I responded to the Corona Police Department regarding an officer-involved shooting. Upon arrival, I met with Corporal Tarrant, who advised that he would be assisting with charting the two involved officers. Corporal Tarrant and I proceeded to the Corona Police Department Traffic Conference Room, where we contacted Officer Evans. I obtained overall photographs of Officer Evan's duty uniform, firearm, and associated equipment. While photographing the front of Officer Evan's vest, I noticed a red stain on the front zipper pocket. I photographed the stain and collected a swab sample, labeling it item #LW1. Corporal Tarrant completed the weapon charting for Officer Evan's firearm and magazines. (Refer to Corporal Tarrant's report for detailed charting information).

At approximately 0330 hours, we contacted the second officer involved, Officer Escoto. I obtained overall photographs of Officer Escoto's duty uniform, firearm, and associated equipment. Corporal Tarrant completed the weapon charting for Escoto's firearm and magazines. (Refer to Corporal Tarrant's report for detailed charting information).

I then responded to the Applebee's east parking lot located at 521 N McKinley Street, Corona CA, to assist. I did not collect or photograph any evidence items at this location.

At approximately 1415 hours I responded back to the Corona Police Department, where I met with Detective C. Espinoza. He requested photographs of police unit #79330 that was parked in the unit parking area of the Corona Police Department. I took overview photos of the interior and exterior of the unit. No evidence was collected from this unit.

Espinoza then asked that I escort him to the Corona Police Department Sally port and take photographs of police unit # 79350. I took overview photos of the interior and exterior of the vehicle. Espinoza pointed out damage to the exterior passenger side rear window. I took additional photographs of the damage to the exterior of the window. I also took additional photos of the interior window showing there was no penetration caused by the damage. No evidence was collected from this unit.

A total of 216 photographs were taken by me and uploaded to Evidence.com. The swab labeled #LW1 was logged into the Corona Police Department Property room.

No further action taken by me at this time.

On 11/18/25, at approximately 0100 hours, I responded to 521 N McKinley Street in the City of Corona, County of Riverside to do scene collection. Using the FARO I collected the evidence. The scene was documented with the use of the FARO Focus 3D terrestrial laser scanner. It was used to capture the scene and evidence. The scanner combines 3D laser measurements to create a cohesive point cloud. The scanner information was used to produce a Scene2Go using FARO Zone 3D software.

I later copied the evidence collected onto a CD and booked the CD into CPD Property and Evidence. I also created a Scene2Go file. The Scene2Go file was also copied onto a CD, which was also booked into CPD Property and Evidence.

On 11-25-26 at approximately 0900 hours, I took possession of Officer Escoto's and Officer Evans' firearms.

I first inspected Officer Escoto's firearm (Staccato Model P, serial number [REDACTED]), and the following is a summary of my findings.

I first checked the operation of the weapon, and it passed a function check. I then individually tested the manual thumb safety and the grip safety, and both worked as designed. Upon disassembly, I noticed that all internal parts appeared to be functioning as designed, with no unusual wear, and I observed no modifications or alterations to any internal components. All internal components of the weapon appeared to be working as designed and within proper tolerances.

I reassembled the firearm and completed another function test, which was passed. I tested the trigger pull weight, which averaged to 5lb 3oz, which is within CPD policy. I then contacted Officer Escoto to return the firearm.

I then inspected Officer Evans's firearm (Glock Model 17, serial number [REDACTED]), and the following is a summary of my findings.

I first checked the operation of the weapon, and it passed a function check. I then individually tested the trigger safety, which worked as designed. Upon disassembly, I noticed that all internal parts appeared to be functioning as designed, with no unusual wear, and I observed no modifications or alterations to any internal components. All internal components of the weapon appeared to be working as designed and within proper tolerances, including the trigger bar and firing pin lug engagement.

I reassembled the firearm and completed another function test, which was passed. I tested the trigger pull weight, which averaged 7lb 12oz, which is within CPD policy. I then contacted Officer Evans to return the firearm.

NOTE: Any reference to blood or bloodstains in this report is visually apparent blood unless otherwise stated. Prior to evidence items PD1-PD22 being collected from the scene, a number placard was placed next to the item and photographed (see photographs for further). The order in which evidence items were marked, photographed, and collected was determined by several factors including the size of the crime scene, lighting and weather conditions, use of FARO to scan and collect measurements of the scene, and coroner processing of the suspect. Officer B. Fisch scanned the scene using FARO and aerial photographs were collected using an unmanned aerial system (UAS). The time stamp on my photographs (item PD28) is one hour ahead due to time change.

DETAILS: On Tuesday 11-18-2025 at around 0100 hours, I received notification of an officer involved shooting in the Applebee's parking lot located at 521 N. McKinley Street, Corona, CA. I was advised to respond to the command post located in the parking lot south of Applebee's for evidence collection. I arrived on scene on 11-18-2025 at around 0300 hours. Upon arrival there was a critical incident briefing. I was advised Detective J. Mason and Detective M. Kushner would be the scene detectives. After the briefing I conducted a walkthrough of the crime scene.

This officer involved shooting occurred in the parking lot east of Applebee's. During my walkthrough of the scene, I located round, orange markers that were placed in the scene by the initial arriving officers to preserve and secure the location of evidence. The orange evidence markers were used due to dark lighting and rainy weather conditions.

I located suspect Kaivak Miranda (06-11-1994) in a parking stall east of Applebee's and south of Promenade Avenue. Miranda was lying on his back with his face up and his hands were handcuffed behind his back. Miranda's head was facing towards the north, and his feet were facing towards the south. Miranda was wearing a cut, chartreuse shirt, brown pants with a gray belt, and brown boots. The following six vehicles were parked in the crime scene:

Victim [REDACTED] Securitas security car: [REDACTED]

The car was parked facing westbound in the parking lot, east of Applebee's, and south of suspect Miranda. The car ignition was on with the headlights and overhead security lights on. The front driver's door was opened and the exterior front driver's door was damaged and the front driver's door window was smashed.

Corona Police Department police unit#79353: 2023, black and white, four-door, Ford, Police Interceptor (1695722, CA). The police unit was parked facing northwest in the parking lot east of Applebee's with the ignition on and the headlights off.

Suspect Kaivak Miranda's car: 2009, gray, four-door, Honda, Civic (9VOE098, CA). The car was facing northwest in the loading area east of Applebee's and had broadsided victim [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] It is unknown if the car ignition was on or off. The passenger headlight was on and there was collision damage to the front of the car.

Victim [REDACTED]

The truck was facing southbound in the loading area east of Applebee's. The truck's front, passenger, wheel and tire were damaged and on the curb. The ignition and headlights were off. The truck was broadsided by suspect Miranda's car. There was collision damage to the front driver's door, driver's side running board, front passenger wheel and tire, passenger side mirror and windshield.

Corona Police Department police unit #79330: 2021, black and white, four-door, Dodge Charger, (1627413, CA). The police unit was parked facing eastbound, partially in the number two lane

and bike lane of eastbound Promenade Avenue at the parking lot driveway east of Applebee's. The car ignition, headlights and overhead lights were on.

Corona Police Department police unit #79350: 2023, black and white, four-door, Ford, Police Interceptor, (1689947, CA). The police unit was parked facing northbound in the parking lot driveway, east of Applebee's and west of suspect Miranda. The vehicle's headlights and overhead lights were off. It is unknown if the ignition was on or off. There was a bullet defect on the rear passenger cargo window.

After my walkthrough, I took overview and close-up photographs of victim [REDACTED] in the parking lot south of Applebee's (see photographs 1-32). [REDACTED] was wearing his black, Securitas, security jacket, black pants and black shoes. [REDACTED] said he did not have any injuries, and I did not see any visible injuries on [REDACTED] said he had broken glass on him from the front, driver's door window being smashed and his back was itchy from the glass. [REDACTED] had cleaned most of the glass off himself prior to me photographing him. There was still some broken glass in his left, front, pants pocket and his left-hand jacket pocket (see photographs 28-32).

After photographing [REDACTED] per the direction of Sergeant J. Waldon, I took overview photographs of the exterior and interior of [REDACTED] Securitas security work car ([REDACTED] CA) and collected [REDACTED] keys and cellphone from the car (see photographs 33-126). Per Sergeant Waldon's direction, I gave [REDACTED] his keys and cellphone so he could go home.

After photographing [REDACTED] and his work car, I took overview photographs of the crime scene. As I was photographing the security car and the crime scene it was dark, wet from rain, and the weather conditions became misty and foggy. For this reason, some of my initial overview photographs taken with a flash reflected off the mist and fog. My overview photographs included the above listed vehicles, collision scene involving suspect Miranda's car and victim [REDACTED] exterior of Applebee's, evidence marked with orange evidence markers, suspect Kaivak Miranda, and first aid supplies around suspect Miranda (see photographs 127-566).

After I completed my initial overview crime scene photographs, it was sunrise and the weather conditions changed to partly cloudy skies. I took overview perspective photographs from the area of the marked evidence facing west and northwest (see photographs 567-586).

I took additional overview and close-up photographs of the collision scene, a white Burlington bag located in the parking lot north of the collision scene, the parking lot east of Applebee's, exterior security cameras located on the east side of Applebee's, and damage to victim Patton's work security car (see photographs 587-680).

Twenty-two evidence items were located and marked with evidence placards 1-22. I later listed the evidence as evidence items as PD1-PD22. I took overview and close-up photographs of evidence items PD1-PD22, including headstamps. After photographing the evidence, Forensic Specialist L. Walker assisted me with collecting the evidence (see photographs 681-839). The following is a list of evidence items I collected at the crime scene:

After collecting evidence items PD1-PD22, I took additional overview and close-up photographs of the exterior and interior of the Securitas security work car (see photographs 840-954).

On 11-18-2025 at around 0920 hours, Riverside County Sheriff's Department Deputy Coroner Ramirez (N8356) arrived at the scene for the deputy coroner processing of suspect Kaivak Miranda (06-11-1994). Deputy Coroner Ramirez processed Miranda for Deputy Coroner Baez (N6851); however, Deputy Coroner Baez is the handling deputy coroner. I took overview and close-up photographs of suspect Miranda during the coroner processing, including photographs of Miranda's injuries, scars, tattoos, and clothing (see photographs 955-1161).

During the processing, Deputy Coroner Ramirez collected Miranda's personal property, a gun-shot residue (GSR) kit from both of Miranda's hands, and fingernail scrapings from both of Miranda's hands. Deputy Coroner Ramirez also located a deformed projectile inside of Miranda's left sleeve on the inside of Miranda's forearm (see photographs 1087-1089). The following is a list of evidence items I collected from Deputy Coroner Ramirez following the deputy coroner processing of suspect Kaivak Miranda:

After the deputy coroner processing, I took overview and close-up photographs of the loading area on the east side of Applebee's after the vehicles had been towed from the collision scene; Corona Police Department unit #79350, including a possible bullet defect and damage to the rear, passenger cargo window; and the parking stall after suspect Miranda was removed from the crime scene by Deputy Coroner Ramirez (see photographs 1162-1212).

After processing the crime scene, I transported evidence items PD1-PD27 to the Corona Police Department forensic laboratory. On 11-18-2025 at around 1420 hours, I contacted Detective B. Walker in the Corona Police Department secured jail sallyport. Victim [REDACTED] was towed and secured in the jail sallyport for further processing. Per the direction of Detective Walker, I took overview and close-up photographs of the Chevrolet pickup truck. I photographed the exterior and interior of the truck; collision damage to the front, driver's door; driver's side running board; passenger side mirror; front, passenger, wheel and tire; and damage to the windshield (see photographs 1213-1355).

I took a total of (1355) photographs and listed the photographs as evidence item PD28. I logged evidence items PD1-PD27 with the Corona Police Department Property and Evidence Section and I uploaded evidence item PD28 into Axon Evidence.com for digital storage. Refer to Officer Fisch's supplemental report for the scene diagram (Scene-2-Go) and Detective Mason's supplemental report for further scene details.
