Our commitment to responsible raw material sourcing

Tromsø Fiskeindustri AS depend on natural resources for a large part of the raw material used in our production. There is an increased pressure on natural resources. Unsustainable use of natural resources, agricultural expansion, deforestation are drivers of biodiversity loss and climate change.

Tromsø Fiskeindustri AS are therefore committed to make sure that our raw materials, and materials in general, are sourced in a responsible way that respect human rights and minimize negative environmental impact. We are also committed to make sure that the natural raw materials are sourced from sustainable resources. Thus, preserving natural resources and helping to maintain biodiversity.

Sourcing of sustainable raw materials

We are committing ourselves to only use marine raw materials from certified sustainable fisheries. The raw materials from agricultural production are sourced from non-genetically modified organisms and produced in a way not contributing to deforestation.

We are only sourcing raw materials from suppliers respecting the Transparency Act as outlined in the OECD guidelines.

We are working to reduce the overall dependence on virgin natural resources and continue to our goal to only source recycled or by-products from sustainable production of marine human food.

Our approach is based on the OECD Guidelines and the UN guiding principles on business and human rights and includes having a risk-based approach to identify, assess and address environmental and human right, risks and impacts at raw material production level.

To comply with this policy, we use relevant information about the raw materials used in our production. As a minimum we need:

- Documents providing full traceability of the natural raw materials
- Statements from our suppliers that they apply to the Transparency Act
- Certificates proving that the raw materials are from a sustainable source, are not genetically modified and produced by certified suppliers
