Colegio Internacional Montessori (CIM) is a private bilingual school enrolling students from Kindergarten through Grade 12. It offers instruction in both English and Spanish. The school opened its doors in 1984 and graduated its first senior class in 1995. CIM provides high-quality education based on the principles of Dr. Maria Montessori, equipping students with life skills and preparing them to become global citizens.

CIM is located in a significant commercial and residential area in Santa Catarina Pinula, Guatemala. The school has a 17.27-acre campus surrounded by a natural reserve. The campus design reflects the Montessori concept of a "prepared environment," integrating philosophy and architecture for the benefit of its students.



Academic Program:

The "Bachillerato en Ciencias y Letras" is the required university – preparatory program for students pursuing higher education. All students complete the full curriculum with a strong foundation in humanities, science, and mathematics; ensuring readiness for university level studies. The course list is an extensive one that leaves no room for electives, although there are "Advance Placement" courses in the program.

4 years of Mathematics (including Algebra, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, and Descriptive Statistics)

4 years of Social Sciences (including Guatemalan Cultural Studies, Introduction to Psychology, and Introduction to Philosophy)

Arts

4 years of the Arts (including Music, Visual Art, Theater and Art History)

Technology & Innovation

4 years of Information & Communication Technology as well as 3 years of Entrepreneurship

Physical Education

4 years of Physical Education

Research & Projects

Students complete 4 years of Research and Projects (Seniors are required to complete a major research project for the Guatemala Ministry of Education called Seminario)

AP Program:

The AP Program is available to students in grade 9 through 12 upon prerequisite completion and teacher recommendation. Students can choose two upon faculty permission. Honors courses are available to students from 9th grade in the Mathematics, English Department and Art. 75% of our enrolled students receive scores of 3 or higher. Since 2026 the Capstone Diploma is available.



Grading System:

The grading system follows the guidelines of the Guatemalan Ministry of Education and uses a numeric scale from 0 to 100, with 60% as the minimum passing grade. Students are required to pass all courses with a minimum score of 60% in order to advance to the next grade level.

For college applications outside of Guatemala, both unweighted and weighted grade point averages (GPA) are calculated. The GPA reflects the cumulative average of all coursework completed in grades 9 through 12 and the relative weight of each course depends upon the credit hour for that particular course. The school does not rank students. Grades are recorded on a bimester basis from January through October. The weighted GPA includes an additional 0.10 points for each Advanced Placement (AP) course.
