

EC*REACH Deputy Director at IPR, Northwestern

JOB DESCRIPTION:

The Institute for Policy Research (IPR) at Northwestern is hiring a **Deputy Director** for the Early Childhood Research Alliance of Chicago (EC*REACH).

The **Deputy Director** will play a critical role in advancing EC*REACH's mission by supporting strategy development, overseeing day-to-day operations, and ensuring the effective execution of research, data, and community engagement activities. The Deputy Director will help lead and operationalize the following three main goals of EC*REACH: (1) conduct and support rigorous and relevant early childhood research to inform decision making; (2) harness data for research; and (3) convene and connect the broader community to build capacity.

The Deputy Director will work under the direction of EC*REACH Faculty Co-Directors (Drs. Terri Sabol and Diane Schanzenbach) at IPR and in collaboration with key partners and stakeholders outside of the university to implement EC*REACH's research agenda and mission.

Key Responsibilities include:

Leadership and Management:

- Build and sustain strong working relationships with Early Childhood Education (ECE) stakeholders, including governmental agencies, foundations, local organizations and the University
- Support Faculty Directors in advancing the ECREACH research agenda in collaboration with the ECREACH Alliance Council
- Coordinate with the EC*REACH Advisory Board Chair and support preparation for and facilitation of board meetings
- Assist in identifying funding opportunities and contribute to grant proposal development and reporting
- Oversee day-to-day operations, including project management, budgeting, reporting requirements, and supervision of EC*REACH staff, and support strategic planning efforts

Research:

- Support the development and launch of new research projects with researchers inside and outside the University

- Contribute to the conception, development, and writing of funding proposals and, as appropriate, serve as project lead
- Coordinate teams of researchers and staff to ensure project milestones are met
- Participate in qualitative and/or quantitative data collection and analysis
- Maintain and support data-sharing agreements with key partner agencies

Communication and Outreach:

- Support the development and implementation of EC*REACH's communications and public informing strategy
- Serve as a liaison to key stakeholders and alliances
- Help convene and support EC*REACH meetings, learning sessions, and public events
- Represent EC*REACH in local and national networks and professional organizations
- Co-author reports, policy briefs, and academic publications and present findings to academic, policy, and community audiences as appropriate

Qualifications:

- A Ph.D. or Ed.D. in a social science discipline or education is required;
- Prior experience in education research and evaluation, including staff or project management experience;
- Proficiency with quantitative and/or qualitative analysis in applied research and evaluation, as demonstrated by publications and public presentations;
- Demonstrated ability in developing and sustaining strong relationships in Chicago or elsewhere (among agencies, school district, and practitioners) with a strong commitment to research-practice partnerships; and
- Applicants must reside in the Chicagoland area.
