# THE HEART OF *knowing Jesus*

The Gathering Well uses these three focus areas of Spiritual Formation to support our approach to the journey of faith.



## BEGIN WITH PRAYER

Communication with God is our starting point. Any resources with this icon are designed to support and equip you to pray, using Scripture as our primary lens and providing questions and prompts to encourage you to talk with God consistently.



## STUDY THE BIBLE

All of our resources are anchored in the truth of God's Word. This icon will indicate spaces where you will engage the Scriptures. We seek to provide educational resources and tools that will help God's Word come alive to you.



## BUILD COMMUNITY

We believe that the life of faith is expressed in community, not isolation. Resources and prompts marked with this icon are geared toward reminding you that we are designed to be in relationship with God *and* with others.



# OUR SPIRITUAL POSTURE



When you see the word **posture** here, we aren't talking about whether you choose to sit or stand to read your Bible. When you see the word **posture**, we want you to think about **the particular way you are considering and approaching the word of God**. Your posture isn't just your physical state of being; it is your spiritual state of being.

Consider the questions below to help take an inventory of your mindset towards Bible study.

- »» what is my attitude towards Bible study?
- »» what do I think Bible study is?
- »» what makes Bible study something I don't want to do?
- »» what makes Bible study something I desire to do?
- »» Am I trusting the Holy Spirit to guide me or am I depending on my own ability?



## PRAY

*Lord, help me to study the Bible with a posture of humility, vulnerability, and surrender to learn from you. Thank you for giving me the Holy Spirit to teach me all things and bring to my mind all that you have said. Settle my heart and mind to reflect on my posture towards Bible study today. Amen.*

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# OUR PURPOSE FOR STUDY



Our experiences with what we know about the Bible are incredibly vast. There are people that have devoted their entire lives to seeking an understanding of the depth and breadth of God's **inerrant** and **infallible** Word. We will never fully grasp the incomprehensible nature of God (on this side of eternity) and that includes aspects of Scripture. However, **it does not mean we do not have a reason or purpose for going to our Bible** to study and discover all that God has revealed in it to those that seek Him there.

## Think about why we study the Bible:

- »» To learn God's story of creation
- »» To see God's provision throughout the story of Scripture
- »» To know God's character of compassion, mercy, and justice
- »» To remember God's promises
- »» To understand God's redemptive plan for the world
- »» To become more like Christ in how we live as a result of grace

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# OUR PLAN OF SURRENDER



We never want to encourage you to pursue your relationship with Jesus as you would a to-do list or a business plan. Your relationship with Jesus is one that is **personal, intimate, and fueled by His love for you** - not the other way around. We encourage you to make a plan and **surrender that plan to Jesus**. Begin with a prayer that asks God to help you determine how to make Bible study an intentional part of your life.

## LET'S REFLECT

Think about what it means to surrender ourselves to God's plan. Surrendering requires us to give up our understanding of control and release our lives into the care of the Lord, trusting the Holy Spirit to provide what we need to be able to do this. Think of the different areas of your life (home, work, school, etc). Which area do you struggle the most to surrender to the Lord? What fear might be behind that struggle?

Consider your daily tasks in this area. What is one way you can practice surrendering to the Lord as you go about your day?

Write a prayer of surrender. Imagine handing your fear, or task, or circumstance over to the Lord. Invite Him to be in control of this area of struggle.
