NGĀ POU O E TIPU E REA WHĀNAU SERVICES

Another year passed and E Tipu E Rea Whanau Services continues to provide well needed quality services to support mātua taiohi, hapū māmā and their pēpi to move closer to achieving their goals of growing, thriving, and becoming rangatira within their whānau and community.

E Tipu e Rea has also successfully secured housing innovation funding to support ending homelessness, and a contract to provide transitional housing for mātua taiohi, hapū māmā and their pēpi. The housing complex will be based on a papakāinga model developed by E Tipu e Rea Whānau Services. E Tipu e Rea Whānau services has been single minded about achieving this goal due to the continuous housing stresses hapū māmā, mātua taiohi and their tamariki face.

We continue to build our relationship with Ngāti Pāoa Iwi

Trust, with partnership hauora events with more planned for the up-and-coming year. Having a strong relationship with Ngāti Pāoa who are mana whenua of places and spaces in Tāmaki allows us to better connect mātua taiohi, hapū māmā and their whanau with the history of Tāmaki, and with opportunities to connect with their own identity, hapū, iwi and te ao Māori. As part of our relationship with Ngāti Pāoa, we have welcomed Rangitahi Pompey our Ngāti Pāoa representative to the E Tipu E Rea Whanau Services Board, her cultural knowledge of Ngati Pāoa and expertise in matauranga Māori and the social services environment is an invaluable contribution to the Board.

E Tipu e Rea has also employed several new staff including a Housing and Whānau Violence Lead, and a Youth Support Worker. E Tipu e Rea have delivered a range of Covid prevention and childhood immunisation initiatives.

HE KŌRERO NĀ TE NGĀTI PĀOA IWI TRUST

E Tipu e Rea Whānau Health and Social Services is an accredited Ngāti Pāoa Iwi Trust organisation. Ngāti Pāoa has significant historical relationships across Auckland and is well placed to support E Tipu e Rea Whānau Health and Social Services and the young whānau they work alongside.

In 2021-2022, we deepened our relationship with E Tipu e Rea, holding our first successful hauora partnership event in Panmure. We look forward to our partnership with E Tipu e Rea growing, with more events and social and health initiatives to support both ngā uri o Ngāti Pāoa and the wider hāpori.

Ngāti Pāoa has significant interests in Tāmaki. The area of interest for Ngāti Pāoa is based on the whakatauki of "Mai Mahurangi ki Ngā Kurī a Whārei" our area of interest is confined to the western shores of the Hauraki Gulf and the eastern suburbs and seaboard of Auckland. Our lead interests in Auckland are; Syliva Park, Panmure, Mt Wellington, Glen Innes, Glendowie, Meadowbank, Kohimarama, Akoranga, Northcote, Devonport, and Takapuna. As well as shared interests across Tāmaki.

Our whenua also comprises islands in the Tāmaki Strait (including Waiheke, Pōnui, Rātōroa, and Tiritiri Matangi Islands) and reaches across to the Coromandel Peninsula over Manaia and Kaimarama. Ngāti Pāoa is one of the iwi of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau (the Tāmaki Collective). It is also a member of the Pare Hauraki and the Marutūāhu Iwi collectives.

As mana whenua of Tāmaki, Ngāti Pāoa is fully committed to supporting E Tipu e Rea to address the inequities and barriers experienced by whānau, design and deliver a range of health and social services (including housing), identify priorities, and meet the needs of whānau.

The last 12 months continued to bring significant growth for E Tipu e Rea Whānau Services. The team have worked tirelessly to expand E Tipu e Rea, with a particular focus on achieving our vision of housing for hapū māmā, mātua taiohi and their pēpi. We are excited about successfully becoming transitional housing providers and look forward to implementing our papakāinga modelled housing complex for wahine hapū, mātua taoihi and their tamariki. The team continued to juggle the demands of Covid-19 and its impact on hapūtanga care, young parents and their wider support systems. Despite the challenges of covid we can deliver a 2021-2022 annual report that celebrates service progress and some fantastic achievements reached by the whānau we work alongside. We value greatly the growing skills and expertise of our team and the growing range of events and services we are now delivering because of them. During the 2021-2022 year, we welcomed Amiria Makoare, our new Youth Support Worker; Emmaline Pickering-Martin, our Policy and Advocacy lead; Cindy Kawana, our Housing and Whānau Violence Prevention Lead: and Joanne Teina, our Lived Experienced Maternal

and Perinatal Mental Health and Hapūtanga Wānanga Lead. We have also prioritised our special relationship with Ngāti Pāoa Iwi Trust and thank them for their ongoing support. We also want to acknowledge the Pāoa cultural knowledge and support we have received from Harley Wade, Drina Paratene, Rangitahi Pompey, Herearoha Skipper, and the encouragement provided by Darna Appleyard, Kerrin Leoni, and other Pāoa Iwi Trust members and wider Pāoa whānau. We have just completed our first Pāoa and E Tipu e Rea partnership event, "Ko Te Reo Te Hauora, Ko Te Hauora Te Reo", for hapū māmā, mātua taiohi, their tamariki and the wider community. This event was held in Panmure, a historical, cultural and spiritually significant area for Pāoa. Over 100 young whānau, hapū māmā and Panmure community members attended to celebrate te rangaihi reo Māori and hauora. Childhood vaccinations, covid boosters, flu jabs, whānau wellbeing activities, hauora kai, te reo Māori games and giveaways, mirimiri and more were all part of the day. We look forward to working with Pāoa on more hauora events and initiatives. We have also seen an increase in media

coverage with the team and young parents and wähine hapū speaking out on issues such as alcohol harm, service and societal discrimination, housing, maternity care, and perinatal mental health. Systemic advocacy is a vital part of our work. Being able to influence the systems that create barriers to the well-being of parents and their pēpi will always be a component of our service until we see tangible change. We appreciate the resourcing from Todd Foundation and JR McKenzie to allow us to contribute to influencing systems and structures, public opinion and policy. I want to thank our Board. our funders. those who donate to us, and the E Tipu e Rea team for their continued dedication to their work, their advocacy and wrap-around social and health support for wahine hapū, mātua taiohi and their tamariki, and for their overall commitment to achieving equality for whānau, hapū and iwi in Tāmaki. As an organisation, our future looks bright, and more importantly, the future of the young whanau we support looks bright. E tipu e rea mo ngā rā o tō ao - grow up and thrive for the days destined to you.

These three strategic plan areas will allow us to continue expanding the work we do under our three pou:

Whānau:

Supporting hapū māmā, mātua taiohi, and their tamariki to gain the tools and skills to fulfill their potential, build on their hauora and strengthen as a whānau. Individual and systemic advocacy are also part of our whānau tautoko.

• Whakapapa:

Encouraging and supporting mātua taiohi and hapū māmā to reconnect with their hapū, their whenua, and their whakapapa, because this has an immeasurable impact on their hauora wairua. As well as, celebrating and sharing the whakapapa of Ngāti Pāoa in Tāmaki.

• Te Ao:

International teen pregnancy rates are most represented by indigenous peoples, and a colonial stigma victimises and sidelines teen mothers as an economic problem. Our kaupapa is to dismantle that stigma by helping mātua taiohi enact their rangatiratanga.
