


# **National Inline Hockey Success**

# University of Melbourne: Performance Invitation

Galen is delighted to host a special theatre performance presented by University of Melbourne students of Italian. Each year, these students undertake a major theatre project, performing a one-act play entirely in Italian. This year's production is **Non tutti i ladri vengono per nuocere** (Not All Thieves Come to Harm), a witty farce by Nobel Prize-winning playwright Dario Fo.

The play offers a humorous critique of morality and hypocrisy within society, while giving audiences a taste of contemporary Italian language and culture. With creative strategies to support audience understanding, the performance is perfect for Italian, Drama and Literature students in Years 9–12.

Two final dress rehearsals will take place at Galen's Arts Centre on Tuesday 28 October at 12pm and 5pm. Each session will run for less than 90 minutes and include a short discussion after the performance.

It's a wonderful opportunity for students to experience live theatre in Italian and gain insight into what studying languages at university can look like.



# **Elmore Field Days**

Earlier this month, our VET Agriculture students had the exciting opportunity to attend the 2025 Elmore Field Days one of regional Victoria's largest and most respected agricultural events. The annual field days provide a unique, hands-on learning experience, showcasing the latest innovations in farming technology, livestock management, machinery, and sustainable agricultural practices.

As part of the excursion, students took part in an Industry Sticker Challenge, designed to encourage meaningful engagement with exhibitors and deepen their understanding of the agricultural industry. Each student (or pair) received an envelope containing at least ten industry stickers and was tasked with finding businesses that sold or promoted the industry listed on each sticker. Students introduced themselves to exhibitors, explained their task, and requested business cards – an activity that helped them step outside their comfort zones, practise professional communication, and make valuable industry connections.

Throughout the day, students explored a wide range of exhibits, from precision agriculture technology and livestock displays to fencing, machinery, and agronomy demonstrations. They gained valuable insights into emerging trends shaping the future of farming and saw firsthand the diverse career pathways within the agricultural sector.

It was a rewarding and inspiring day filled with learning, networking, and real-world discovery — a perfect example of how the VET Agriculture program combines classroom learning with practical experience. A big thank you to the students for representing Galen with enthusiasm, curiosity, and pride.



# Year 11 Real Care Baby Simulator Experience

Last term, all students completing Unit 2 Health and Human Development participated in the Real Care Baby Program, an immersive learning opportunity that offered a realistic insight into the challenges of early parenthood. Each student took home an infant simulator for a 24-hour period, stepping into the role of a young parent.

Throughout the experience, students were responsible for responding to their baby's needs, including feeding, burping, rocking, changing nappies, and ensuring the infant's general wellbeing. The simulator responded unpredictably, mimicking real-life infant behaviour and requiring students to always be attentive and responsive.

The program provided valuable insights, such as:

- Individual Needs: No two babies are the same—each requires consistent care, patience, and emotional availability.
- 2. **Demanding Schedules:** Infant care is unpredictable and often interrupts regular routines, demanding constant attention.
- 3. **Lifestyle Adjustments:** The commitment of parenting dramatically alters daily life, reinforcing the importance of readiness and responsibility.

This program emphasised how parenting influences a child's physical, social, emotional, and intellectual development. It also prompted meaningful reflection on the realities and responsibilities of becoming a parent.

A big thank you to the parents who helped supported the program at home and to the teachers who were accommodating within their classes. With most students enjoying their experience as temporary caregivers, the program offered powerful, hands-on learning experiences that is sure to leave a lasting impression.







