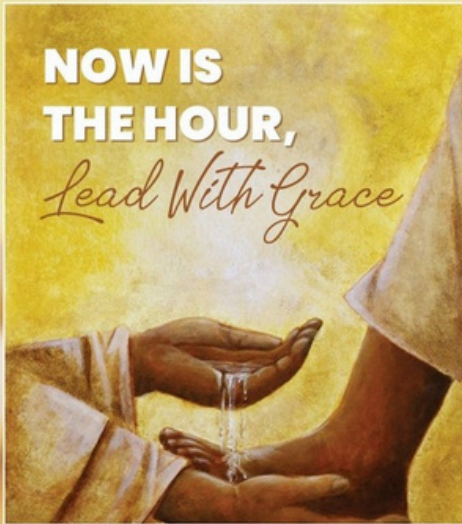

Bold Ideas, Brave Design

On Thursday 5 February, our Year 9 and 10 Textiles students, along with the Year 11 Product Design class, travelled to Melbourne to explore the Vivienne Westwood and Rei Kawakubo exhibition. The visit offered a rare opportunity to experience the groundbreaking work of two of the most influential designers in contemporary fashion.

Students attended a presentation by gallery staff before they were able to closely examine the designers' innovative garments, unconventional materials, and bold construction techniques. The exhibition highlighted both Westwood's rebellious, punk-inspired aesthetic and Kawakubo's sculptural, avant-garde approach to form, providing valuable insight into how fashion can push creative and cultural boundaries.

The excursion sparked lively discussion and idea-gathering, with many students leaving inspired to experiment more boldly in their own projects. It was a memorable day that broadened our understanding of design and encouraged students to think beyond traditional textiles and product design conventions.

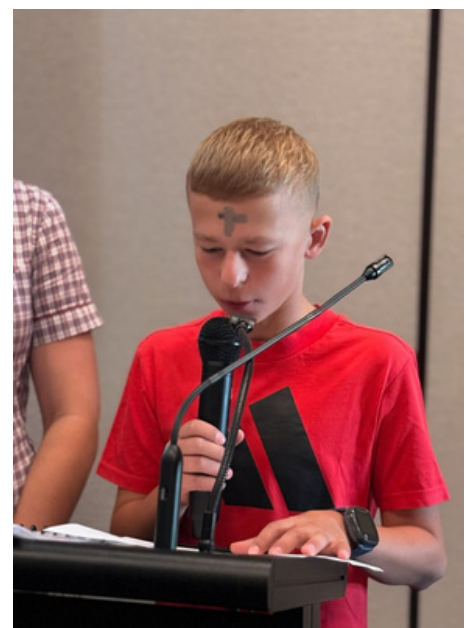

Both brothers have also enjoyed consistent success throughout the Victorian Mountain Bike Championship Series, with Levi finishing 1st overall and Jackson securing 4th overall.

Their success at the state championships and in the series was the result of rigorous training, support from their local bike shop, Westend Cycles, and their involvement in both the Victorian and National Mountain Bike Academies. Here, they benefited from expert coaching and training opportunities at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) in Canberra, as well as at top mountain bike parks in Victoria.

Their dedication and hard work continue to pay off, and we wish them all the best as they prepare for upcoming national competitions in Canberra and at Mount Buller.
