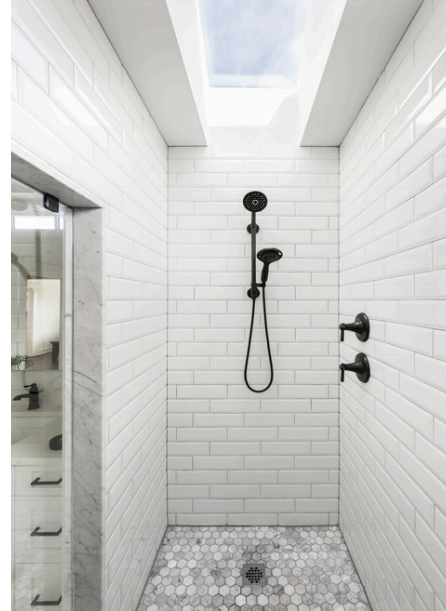


Greenlake Craftsman

SEATTLE, WA



Originally a one-story home with an unfinished basement, this Green Lake Craftsman was remodeled to create a dream home for a growing family while remaining true to the character of the original architecture. White paint, hardwood floors, and neutral tile and stone provide a timeless material palette, while custom built-ins, columns, banisters, and ceiling details reinforce the home's Craftsman roots. To better support the family's lifestyle, the main level was largely reconfigured and the home was raised two feet to create a full-height basement below. The lower level now functions as a complete mother-in-law unit with a living area, kitchenette, bedroom suite, and laundry, with the option to be fully separated from the main home.

A new second-story addition houses all bedrooms, allowing the main floor to expand into a generous kitchen and dining sequence with a new office and powder room. The kitchen features full-height cabinetry and a large island designed for gathering, while the adjacent dining room is framed by four columns and a box beam ceiling. Upstairs, a light-filled reading nook anchors the landing, with children's bedrooms leading to a shared bath and a vaulted primary suite beyond. Skylights bring natural light into both the walk-in closet and the spacious shower, creating a serene retreat.
