The aim is for each participant to draw their favourite animal on a piece of paper held on their head, then have the group guess what they attempted to draw—all in good fun, with no competitive pressure.



Family Objects

Encourage Creativity in a Fun Context:

Family members get to express themselves creatively by drawing their favourite animal on a piece of paper placed on their head. This playful activity inspires imaginative self-expression in a light-hearted setting.

Promote Group Interaction and Laughter:

Participants join in a humorous icebreaker that sparks laughter and joyful interaction, helping to break down barriers and build positive connections among family members.

Develop Communication and Observation Skills:

After the drawing, everyone practices describing and guessing the animals on each other's heads, enhancing observation skills and fostering effective, playful communication.

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Objective:

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Players:

- Suitable for all ages.
- Ideal for groups in family gatherings, meetings, workshops, classrooms, or casual settings.

Materials:

- Blank A4 paper (one per participant)
- Pens or pencils

Setup:

1. Distribute Materials:

- Give each participant a piece of blank A4 paper and a pen or pencil.

2. Positioning:

- Each participant places the paper on top of their head, ensuring it stays in place.

Gameplay:

1. Drawing Phase:


- Participants have 30 seconds to one minute to draw their favourite animal on the paper atop their head.
